re Serj<sup>t</sup> Herbert Dewling No 45

Yesterday I left at the Pay & Award Office an Application for Separation Allowance from Widow Dewling, mother of the above. I was told that it might be one or two months before a meeting would be held at which the application would be considered.

I have received a letter from Serj<sup>t</sup> Dewling written from France, under date 19<sup>th</sup> March, in which he says

"To day I received a letter telling me of Harry's illness and also how badly mother is placed financially -  
"As no doubt you are aware, the NPA Govt. are allowing the dependants of men of the Regiment so much per month from date of enlistment. Under this regulation mother is entitled to \$20. per month from Oct. /14 to Sept. 24/17 (I was wounded in Sept /17 and therefore mother cannot draw the allowance after this date as it falls to my wife) which amounts to about \$700."

Mr Dewling is in need - I have helped her with coal during the winter, and I have also

loaned her money to get necessaries -

Cannot some part of the Separation allowance be paid to her without delay? Her daughter earns only \$5. per week, & pays her mother \$2<sup>00</sup>. The son has been seriously ill, and bears a burden rather than a help - Her tiny dwelling is mortgaged to the extent of \$180.

Say: Darling says

"If you could possibly see your way clear to do anything for me regarding this, I would greatly appreciate it, and give you full sanction and authority to act on my behalf."

Will you kindly give this matter your early attention

Thanks for acknowledgement of my letter in reference to 150 Francs paid me by Lt. Gane.

In ~~this~~ letter you called my attention to the fact that I am in debt. According to Statement furnished by you I am, but I had been drawing against Subsistence Allowance of One Dollar per day this being the same amount paid to the Canadian Orderly Room Sergeants and also the same as you pay ~~the~~ the men at your office independent of rank.

Until I shall I hear from you again I will draw 25 ~~per~~ Francs per week, exclusive of Lodging which amounts to 60 Francs per Month, this is for my room alone, independent of messing.

Dear Sir:

I am enclosing Pay Book as requested by you. Also please find statement of my account.

Regarding the mess allowance in France. The messing & billet allowance up to April 15 given to the Canadians was \$1.00 per day. The amount allowed to us by the Imperial Government is 1.8<sup>0</sup> for messing and 6<sup>0</sup> for billeting which totals 2<sup>0</sup> 2<sup>0</sup>. which I have deducted in every case. After April 15 the allowance had been reduced to 75<sup>0</sup> a day and I have made deductions accordingly as statement will show.

You will notice I have made my  $\mathcal{L}$  up to June 30<sup>th</sup> 16 as I expect it will be about that time before I will receive my paybook from you. I have also credited myself with ration allowance while on furlough.

During my visit to one of the Hospitals here quite recently I came across Lt. Gane. He is suffering from "shin fever" and is being invalided to England. Knowing that you knew him quite well I am sure you will be pleased that he is doing splendidly and is not in any danger, but due to the fact it will take some time before he can use his legs, the Doctor thought it would be much better for him to spend his convalescence there.

As he was expecting to leave at any moment he gave me what French money he had on his person (150 Francs), for which I gave him a receipt. Would it be in order for you to pay this amount in sterling to him when he arrives at your office and charge same to my account or shall I get it changed here and remit it to you to hold for him. I think it would be better if you charge it to me as there is a possibility of it being lost should it be sent by letter post or otherwise. He has a receipt from me for the amount.

We are exceptionally busy at present as the General has asked for a lot of information regarding our casualties since July 1st. to date. Sergt. Mew arrived here Nov. 6th. and we have not enough to do at the present time to keep us busy for some time.

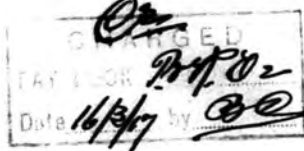



Your letter of the 11th inst., to hand. The box of records has not yet turned up but doubtless it will soon and we will endeavour to keep it in safe custody. I wrote officially to the 3rd Echelon the other day and asked them to send all documents and records here, eventually to become the property of the Newfoundland Government. That is most important.

I don't think the 1st Bn. will be leaving Rouen for some weeks according to present plans.

As regards sending for you, I think the best thing you can do is to ask the O. i/c Inf. Section No-1., to apply to this Office for your return to this Country, when we might do something from this end. As a matter of fact we are pretty full up here at the moment, and I don't know if the Major would sanction any additions. If you could only wait a few more weeks we hope the whole outfit will be out of France.

Major Timewell is still in Newfoundland, but ought to return within a few weeks.

When you were over last I showed you the strong letter we were writing to O. C. 1st Battalion about your promotion to Staff Sergeant.
