STATEMENT OF PRISONER OF WAR

No 2332 Pte. FREDERICK DIAMOND, Flat Island, Placentia Bay.

ENLISTED March 1916 PROCEEDED OVERSEAS July 1916.

Coy. IN FRANCE C Coy., attached Headquarters as sniper.

PLACE AND DATE OF CAPTURE Monchy-le-Preux, April 14th. 1917.

CIRCUMSTANCES OF CAPTURE\*--- I was sent to C Coy. for duty and went over with them. We were dug in at our first objective, and after the heavy counter-attack I was wounded in the right shoulder in the withdrawal, and lay unconscious on the ground. When I came to, the Germans had gone beyond me and some of them came up to where I was. I pretended to be dead, and after they had stripped my pockets of everything in them they left me. I lay there unable to move till next morning about daylight when they came and looked at me again. Again I feigned death, as I did not want to be captured, and they went off. About 4p.m. that day I dozed off, and they must have seen me make some movement, for two Germans came up to me with pointed bayonets and carried me off.

LIFE AND TREATMENT WHILST A PRISONER.----- I was taken back to a Dressing Station where a doctor dressed me and gave me an injection. The next day I was sent to Douai to hospital for about three days, and was fairly well treated there. Then I was sent on into Germany to Hamborn, still to hospital, where I remained for seven months. The life here on the whole was not too bad, although food was very scarce and very little was done for me for the treatment of my wounds, and I had to look after myself for the most part. My arm and shoulder were giving me a lot of trouble and pain, but I was simply told to go and wash it in warm water. In this hospital I got my first parcels from the Red Cross and some mail from home, but no private parcels.

Then I was sent on to Dulmen Camp about 10 hours' train journey away, supposed to be fit for duty. Here I remained for about a month. Thence we were sent on to Mannheim, an exchange camp, for three weeks. The food was worse than ever here, and we just had enough to eat to keep us alive.

Then we were sent up to Holland for repatriation to England on exchange, and reached Boston, England, on Jan, 7th. 1918, and I went to Wandsworth.

My right arm is now useless, and the doctors in England told me that if I had been properly looked after in the first instance and operated on in time, my arm would have been saved; but practically no treatment at all was given me whilst I was a prisoner in the hands of the Germans.



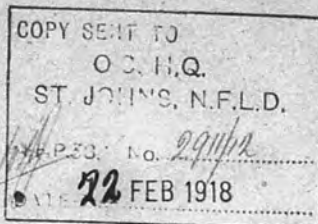

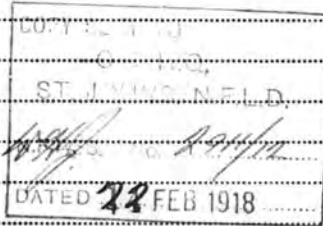
