The above mentioned ex soldier is now living at 17 Wellington Street, Newton on Ayr, Ayr, Scotland. He was married some months before his demobilisation, and the cost of his wife's passage to this country is chargeable to Newfoundland Government funds.

A letter has now been received from him stating that he wishes to go to Canada, and to bring his wife with him. I should be glad if you will arrange for the payment to Mrs. Dick's of the sum equivalent to 1st class passage from Ayr to St. John's via Liverpool; or if it would be more convenient, to arrange for the passage of Dick's and his wife and two children and to pay the sum before mentioned on account of her passage to the Steamship Company. The passage of the elder of his two children is also a charge against Newfoundland Government funds. Dick's own passage and that of the younger of the two children must be paid by himself.

Reference obverse:

Cheque for £44:14:4 (Forty four pounds, fourteen shillings & four pence) the sum equivalent to 1st Class passage from Ayr to St. John's via Liverpool for Mrs Dicks and her elder child was forwarded to Mr Dicks on the 22nd November.

I would add that Mr Dicks and family sailed for Canada by the ss. "CASSANDRA" on December 10th.

Descriptive Return of a Soldier Discharged on Account of Disability.

The above mentioned ex soldier is now living at 17 Wellington Street, Newton on Ayr, Ayr, Scotland. He was married some months before his demobilisation, and the cost of his wife's passage to this country is chargeable to Newfoundland Government funds.

A letter has now been received from him stating that he wished to go to Canada, and to bring his wife with him. I should be glad if you will

arrange for the payment to Mrs. Dick's of the sum equivalent to 1st class passage from Ayr to St. John's via Liverpool; or if it would be more convenient, to arrange for the passage of Dick's and his wife and two children and to pay the sum before mentioned on account of her passage to the Steamship Company.

The passage of the elder of his two children is also a charge against Newfoundland Government funds. Dick's own passage and that of the younger of the two children must be paid by himself.


