With reference to the bills for Officers' uniforms which you were putting through and about which I spoke to you over the telephone this morning, I have discussed the matter with Mr. Munn, the Treasurer, and we are agreed in pointing out to you that the Finance Committee at its last meeting, having had before it a representation from Capt. Montgomerie, on behalf of the Officers of the Reserve Force re local uniforms, decided to pay the cost of these and not require the Officers to meet the amount from their allowance of \$150.00 each. In view of the fact that all but one of the Officers appear to have incurred an expenditure of not more than \$23.00, we think this might be regarded as a maximum, and that in case any Officer's account exceeded that sum the excess should be deducted from his Allowance of \$150.00. Will you kindly take the necessary steps to give effect to this.
