Doran had previously served in the Royal Naval Reserve No. 1365X. He was discharged from that Force as a time expired man having completed his 12 months engagement. He enlisted in the Regiment on March 28th 1916, and after a period of training in St. John's, was discharged on August 18th 1916 as Medically Unfit and without having been overseas. The report of the Senior Medical Officer was:- "I am of the opinion that this man is unfit for Military Service, his condition is not due to Military Services." He later went to Canada and enlisted with the Canadian Expeditionary Force. He applied for a course in Woodworking on February 16th 1920. Medical Report states general condition good, able to resume general work and for this reason the Committee were unable to grant a course. This man was boarding on George's Street and left without paying his board bill, the owner of the house applied to this Department for payment of this bill. In spite of this he is known to have been repeatedly playing cards for stakes considerably higher than the average, and again he was visited different offices in the Militia Building reeking with dope of some sort, apparently essences.
