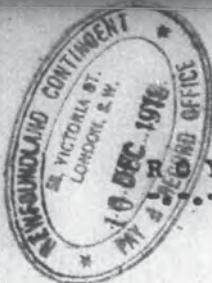

The attached correspondence with the War Office has been noted.

For your information, I would state that Newfoundlanders residing in the United States subject to draft under American Military Service regulations, are allowed sixty days to enlist with the American Force or to proceed to their own country. In the event of their deciding to return to their own country, they are given a permit to leave the United States and the Canadian authorities allow them to pass through Canada on their way to Newfoundland, if they produce satisfactory proofs that they are not liable to Military Service in Canada.

In regard to Newfoundlanders serving in Canada, an agreement exists between the Newfoundland Government to the effect that Newfoundlanders drafted under the Canadian Military Service Act, are allowed to transfer to the Newfoundland Military Forces.

With reference to the two men mentioned in the ~~obverse~~ and any other such cases as may arise, their transfer to the 2nd., Bn. at Winchester should be facilitated and copy of their attestation sheets and other necessary copies of records sent to this Department for information.

ENLISTMENTS.

1. P. A. R. O. Letter 12210/325/R. & G. to W. O. (A.G. 13)
Two men, who were recruited in Buffalo, New York have reached this country, and have been posted from Bownslow to the 2nd. Bn. Royal Newfoundland Regiment, Hazeley Down Camp, Winchester.
It is not clearly understood by what arrangement these men, who were apparently first sent from the United States to Canada and came over with an American draft, have been allotted to the Royal Newfoundland Regiment. Any information you may be able to give on the matter of recruiting Newfoundlanders in the United States will be appreciated.
Meanwhile, these particular men, whose names are Nicholas Scott and George Doyle, have been re-attested on A.F. 23506 in the above named Regiment.
2. I am directed to acknowledge your letter of the 51st. ultimo No 12210/325/R. & G., regarding two men who are reported to have been recruited in Buffalo, and posted to the 2nd. Battalion of the Royal Newfoundland Regiment, on their arrival in this country.
I am to inform you that the Canadian and British Recruiting Mission in United States accepts men in the British Army and the Canadian Forces and that applicants are allowed to state at the time of attestation which unit they would prefer to join. It is assumed that these men expressed a preference for the Canadian Forces and were under the impression that the unit of their choice viz. the Royal Newfoundland Regiment, was administered by the Canadian Military Authorities.
On arrival in this country with other British subjects from the United States, these men were posted according to the notations on their documents made at the time of their enlistment, and the Posting Officer was not aware that the British and Canadian Recruiting Mission was not authorized to attest men for the Newfoundland Contingent.
I am to request that the original documents of the two men referred to, namely, Nicholas Scott, and George Doyle, may be forwarded for inspection.
I am to add that recruitment of Newfoundlanders in the United States does not come within the scope of the British and Canadian Recruiting Mission and that these two men must have enlisted under a misapprehension.

I am directed to avert to War Office letter, Numbered as above dated 6th., inst., with which you forward the documents of Private's Scott and Doyle, which are returned herewith.
I am to say that it is not proposed to instruct the British and Canadian Recruiting Mission in the United States not to accept Newfoundlanders living in the United States for enlistment, as it is assumed, should any natives of Newfoundland in the United States come forward as volunteers for Service in Newfoundland Contingent, that their service will be accepted to you provided they are fit for general Service.
If you concur in this suggestion, it is proposed to forward any such men, together with their documents to Winchester immediately on their arrival in this country. It is thought however, that very few, if any, cases of this description are likely to occur in the future.

The object is to provide, by means of contributions from the soldier and from the Government, a weekly payment of the same amount (within limits) as the soldier used to pay for the dependant's own support. If a soldier allots more than his minimum share the extra allotment is added to the weekly payment, but does not affect the Government's contribution.

EXAMPLES:—(1) A single dependant.—A soldier living at home before he enlisted paid 18s. a week to his mother. If it is settled that, after due allowance has been made for all the loss caused by the withdrawal of his support, the cost of his own maintenance should be put at 7s. a week, 6s. is taken as the amount he used to pay for his mother's support. Provided the soldier allots 1s. 9d. a week, the Government will pay the remaining 4s. 3d., and the weekly payment to the mother will be 6s. If the soldier allots 8s. 6d., the extra 1s. 9d. will be paid in addition, and the mother will receive 7s. 9d.; if he allots 6s. 3d. she will receive 5s. 6d.

(2) More than one dependant.—If a soldier living at home before he enlisted supported his mother and father, they may receive a weekly payment of as much as 17s. 6d., provided the soldier used to give this sum for their support. The soldier's share of this weekly payment would be 3s. 6d., and the Government would pay the remaining 14s. If the soldier allotted 5s. 3d., the weekly payment would be 19s. 3d.

N. B.—A soldier cannot allot more than three-quarters of his pay.

If more than one soldier contributed to the joint support of more than one person, each soldier may claim for a different dependant, but a separate application must be made by each soldier, and each must make the necessary contribution from his pay.

A person entitled to full Separation Allowance as the wife or child of a soldier cannot draw the allowance as a Dependant.

If Separation Allowance is claimed on behalf of a woman and children (if any) under Class B, paragraph 44, Separation Allowance Regulations, the full allotment must be made as for a wife (3s. 6d. in the case of a Private or Corporal).
