I beg to advise you that I am just in receipt of a message from the High Commissioner's Office, London, to the following effect, namely:-

"Caretaker Beaumont Hamel reports finding
"twelve more bodies Newfoundland soldiers in
"Park believe have identified 1845 Private George
"Winsor 1054 Private Arthur Driscoll certain
"other effects recovered which will be forwarded
"later with official report after investigation
"by War Graves Commission and this Office."

I do not think it wise to make this information public at the present juncture as the Authorities are not certain themselves as to the identification of the two bodies named in the message, and it would be probably safer to reserve publication until the matter has been confirmed. We shall doubtless have a letter in due time from the High Commissioner's Office regarding the matter, with further particulars.

I beg to forward herewith letter under date 7th instant from the High Commissioner's Office, London, notifying that recently the remains of ten bodies have been discovered within Beaumont Hamel Park. Some of these have been identified, but others have been so meagre in regard to recognisable effects that identification has not been possible. With the letter I send you a cardboard box containing the effects that were found on certain of the unidentified bodies. It is desired that you will, by searching your records, by consulting the G.W.V.A., and by making enquiries either publicly or privately, endeavour to ascertain the identity of these bodies. Kindly take up the matter without delay and make your report to this Office in due course.

Dear Sir:-

With reference to your letter of August 26th.1929, enclosing communication from the High Commissioner's Office, regarding the finding of ten bodies recently, I acknowledge receipt of box containing effects taken from these remains.

In the matter of identification, I beg to report as follows:-

- Effects No. 24312. I am informed by Lt. Col. Rendell that the compass is a regular ordnance issue, but beyond this no indication of possession is discernible.
- 24313 Impossible to identify.
- 24314 The pieces of boot are taken from boots issued by the Imperial Ordnance Department. It is hardly possible that boots issued to the troops in Newfoundland were in use by those who took part in the action at Beaumont Hamel on July 1st. The numbers on these pieces have no meaning to anyone in Newfoundland, so far as I can ascertain. As a means of identification, these are, therefore, of no use.
- 24315 Identification from initials on cap of fountain pen ~~and~~ being investigated in London.
- 24329 The same remarks apply as to 24314.

Regarding No. 24316, and the supposed identification as belonging to No. 400, Cpl. R. Pittman, I am credibly informed that no man of the first five hundred, with one possible exception, could have been accepted for service if he were false teeth. It is, of course, possible that the

plates were supplied after arrival in the United Kingdom, but as no record appears in our archives, it is impossible to say that such is actually the case.

I have spoken of these effects and asked information from several of the officers of the Royal Nfld. Regiment, but they were unable, owing to the long lapse of time, to throw any light on the matter. They were further of the opinion, which I share, that unless positive identification can be assured, it is inadvisable to approach the next of kin of the supposed soldiers, as such procedure would raise hopes that might later be overthrown, with renewed sorrow to the bereaved.

I beg to advise, then, that in my opinion, unless something more definite that the evidence produced can be obtained, ~~that~~ the matter be allowed to stand in its present position, and that the bodies ~~of~~ be considered to be those of unidentified Newfoundlanders.

I am returning herewith, the letter from the High Commissioner's Office, together with map of the district in which the bodies were recovered.
