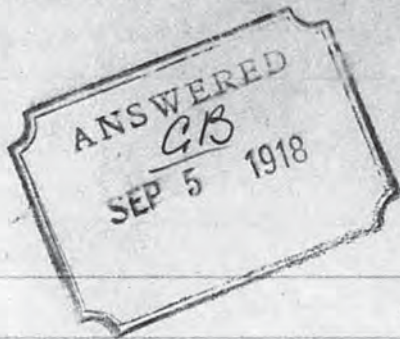
I beg to acknowledge receipt of your letter of the 2nd inst., wherein you express a desire that your son, #2563 L/Cpl. L. Dubourdieu, be considered for discharge from the Regiment, and in reply I beg to inform you that this is a matter for the decision of the authorities on the other side, where L/Cpl. Dubourdieu is located. If his health is such that he is no longer fit for service, he will, without doubt, be recommended for discharge by the Medical Officer. If, however, such is not the case and he is still desirous of having steps taken for the matter of his discharge, he must do so through his Commanding Officer.

I read with a great deal of interest that portion of your letter relating to your record of a public official, and the alleged wrong treatment which you received at the hands of the past Government. As this is a matter which I am not officially connected with, I reserve any comments thereon. The proper channel for you to express your dissatisfaction with your treatment would be through the Prime Minister or the Colonial Secretary for the information of the Government.

The extract attached from the letter of Cpl. F.A. James is such that gives a good account of the character and ability of your son as a soldier, and I can only express my personal gratification that his pal speaks so enthusiastically of him.

Dear Sir:-

About six weeks ago I received from my
son Lt. J. H. Bourdieu, 2563, from France, ^{a letter} in which
he says that his health is not very good and at the
last medical board examination he was marked
B.1. He stated in that letter that he would have to
undergo an examination about a month later and yesterday
I received a cable from him on business in which he
incidentally referred to a "furlough", but did not say if
it were a short-furlough to England or a more extended
furlough to return home. He was in hospital in
England all winter and I am under the impression
that his health has given way, although he was
very "fit" the first eighteen months of his service
with the Regiment in France.

Apart altogether from
that, I have been contemplating the possibility of trying

to secure my Son's discharge from the army, provided always that he would be satisfied to accept such a discharge. I have not consulted him at all about the matter and am entirely ignorant of his sentiments on the question.

My reason for making this somewhat unusual proposition will be found in the unjust and shameful manner in which the Government has treated me after a service of forty years, during which period I have faithfully and conscientiously striven to the best of my poor ability to give satisfaction, both to the Government and the public in whatever Capacity I may have been employed and without being guilty of egotism I think that I may say I have succeeded in so doing.

In the year 1900 I was appointed Sub-Collector of Customs at this port.

At that time French interests and influences were almost supreme here. In other words this particular part of the Coast was the happy hunting ground and distributing Centre of the French fishermen from St. Pierre. Time will not permit me to go into details, but I may say that by the end of 1901

the Smuggling operations of the Pirois had received such a check as to make the work no longer safe or profitable so much so indeed that they gradually lost their interest in the Coast and its relations. The part that I took in exposing their illicit operations and in helping to reduce them, is well known to the Customs Department, as it was to the Government of the day in which the work was done, but the memory of these Services seem to have been very short-lived.

As you are aware the Dominion Iron & Steel Co. have within the past six years opened up and developed within this port a limestone quarry which gives considerable employment during the summer season. This industry has, by the importations necessary there to and the exportation resulting therefrom, added considerably to the Customs business of the port. Up until the beginning of this season, when the "Quarry" or Aquathuna as it is better known by, was separated from this port and declared a separate port of entry, with a resident Collector; the work of the whole port (including Aquathuna) was done by me with a couple of tidewaiters and as far as I know with satisfaction to all concerned. In the division of the port no provision whatever was made to indemnify me for any loss that I may sustain.

thereby. I was not even notified that such a division was to take place, but accidentally hearing it I went to St. John's to lay my case before the Minister of Customs. I saw the Minister on the morning of the day on which the estimates were to be laid before the Assembly. When I stated my case he recognized the justice of it by raising my percentage of my Commission on Collections from $2\frac{1}{2}$ to $4\frac{1}{2}$ per cent in order to bring my salary up to its limit. The change in the estimates was made then and there in my presence. This will compensate to some extent for the loss of the Collections from Aquathuna, but not to for the loss for fees for overtime, clearing and entering the Company's Steamers out of hours, possible Commissions on light-dues and other lawful advantages. Were there any real necessity for the division of the post or were I no longer capable or competent to do the work or were there any public interests to be protected, I would make no complaint, but when none of these conditions exist and when I feel that I am unnecessarily deprived in these days of high cost of living, of a means that I possessed for six years of lawfully adding \$200.00 to my salary, I feel that I have been unjustly dealt with and what is more there is a moral aspect to the case that I cannot overlook, for to everyone acquainted with local conditions and geography the natural impression made on their mind is that I must have been guilty of some grave misdemeanor to have been so unnecessarily deprived

Dear Sir,

In a recent draft I arrived home from England for discharge from the Regiment. Whilst serving with the Regiment in the field I was a particular friend of your son Jack's.

I am sure Jack was far too modest a boy ever to tell you in his letters that his services were appreciated by the Regiment, therefore I considered it my duty as his friend to give you some idea of his fearlessness, dash and shrewd judgment. He was a sniper and consequently it fell to his lot, in Company with others, of locating the hidden "Listening Posts" of the enemy. In the trenches or "going over the top" he was alert as a hare and rather looked upon it as one is accustomed to look upon a day's sport. Jack's officers knew his worth and the Regiment appreciated his coolness and courage. That he did not rise high in the ranks was rather, not so much due to his lack of ability as to his lack of appreciation of high office. Time and time again he was offered promotion, but preferred to remain with the boys in the ranks.

In conclusion I should like to Congratulate you in offering such a son to our ^{over} Country. Jack has done his

duty nobly and well and is a credit
to his home Country and Empire.

of so important part of my jurisdiction. If therefore I can secure my son's discharge from the Army and get his appointment to this office in my stead, I shall resign therefrom and take up some other form of employment.

Now as to my son - When the war broke out he was at College and too young for Military Service. In the winter of 1916 I had secured a Government position for him, the duties of which he would assume in May of that year. In April he decided that he would decline the position, that it was his duty to do his bit for his Country and the Empire. After considerable thought, I agreed with him and although he is my only son, as far as personal help and support are concerned, I believed that I was conscientiously bound to ^{let him} follow the dictates of his mind and accordingly made the sacrifice and a grateful Government has rewarded me by humiliating me, if not actually directing me, before the Country.

It is not for me to comment on his service to his Country, but I beg to enclose an extract ~~that~~ from a letter that I received by last night's mail from St. John's, written by Corporal J. James of a lately discharged soldier, who was a close companion of my son on the battle fields of France, which will prove that he was no imitation soldier, but did his share in maintaining the reputation that our boys have gained for courage in the face of difficulties. I must apologize for

inflicting on you the task of wading through this long and tiresome epistle, but it is necessary that I go into these details that you may understand my position. If it be possible to secure my son's discharge, provided he will assent to it, I would consider it a favour if you would inform me of the necessary steps to take in order to do so.
