
Dear Mr. Dwyer:

John Dwyer, who was reported to you on October 16th 1917 as having died of wounds at the 61st Casualty Clearing Station, France, on October 10th, and his grave site was forwarded to you on April 5th which stated that #2725 Pte. J. Dwyer was buried at Desingham British Cemetery 2½ miles North of Beveringhe, Belgium as was reported to you by the Director of Graves Registration Units. Since that we have not had any further details concerning your late son. Any further particulars we get concerning him will be immediately communicated to you.

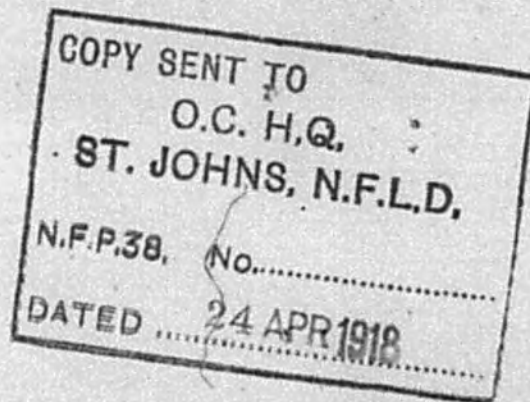

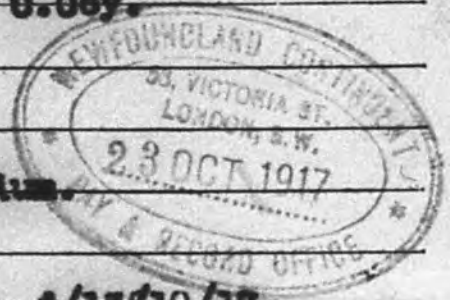

I believed he was killed or fatally wounded in Oct. 9th, 1917, but his parents would like to know if he was injured in the legs or exactly in what parts of the body, although I cannot see personally what gratification these details can give the poor people. However, if any light can be thrown on the matter I would be grateful.

Mr. Dwyer also contends that the service ribbons, earned by the deceased, have not been sent to him. If this is correct, and they are now issuable, I would be glad to see they are safely delivered, if they are sent through me.
