Dear Sir:

#3858 Pte. Hugh S. England, son of George & Annie England, enlisted at St. John's on June 15th/17 & on March 13/18 was killed somewhere in France. He was the main support of the home, the father being unable to do much hard labour due to physical disability, etc. No Separation Allowance was made in part because the parents & Hughie didn't know about it in time or understand how to obtain it & partly because the parents that to ask their son to have it granted might handicap him, therefore, they willingly did the best they could without it or troubling him to get it hoping that no accident or fatality would happen.

An allotment of (60 cts) sixty cents per day has been recd. by Mrs. England since Aug. 1st/17 but no other help has been given her by the Govmt. since her boy was killed or enlisted. Mrs. England has been informed, whether correctly or not, that some time mothers, whose sons were not killed & have returned home for some time, are yet being paid a separation allowance; also that other mothers, whose sons were killed, have recd. or are to recv. seventy dollars (\$70) gratuity for six months after the death of their boy. Mrs. E. knows that anything that which cannot be done for another mother in her position cannot be done for her & that anything another is getting she should recv. a similar amount. She is only looking for & expecting what is due her.

(given as to whether she is to recv. it or not. You can see the
(report of Mrs. England's condition from these papers. A note

(says "The case will not be considered by the B.P.C. until Mar.20.,
(unless Mrs. Engand wishes it' and I would advise her not to press
(it as to me it appears that it would not be a possible case & if
(the pension was not granted the allotment would cease." I ask on

Rev. and dear Sir:

I have the honour by direction to acknowledge receipt of your letter of the 9th inst., with reference to the case of the parents of #3856 Pte, Hugh S. England, Royal Newfoundland Regiment, deceased.

I am to advise you that the information received as to Separation Allowance being payable to mothers after the return of their sons is not correct. The only case where Separation Allowance is continued is where a Gratuity is being paid a man who, before discharge, was leaving an Allotment to a dependent mother, and where this mother was drawing Separation Allowance on his account. In such cases the Separation Allowance is paid with his gratuity. As to mothers receiving \$70.00 gratuity for a period of six months on account of their sons who have been killed, I may say that this is entirely incorrect. There is no gratuity payable on account of a deceased soldier or sailor. The gratuity referred to

is payable to the man himself upon return for the purpose of helping him to re-establish himself in civil life. It is \$70.00 per month for men who are not the sole support of their dependents, and \$100.00 per month, i.e. \$70.00 plus \$30.00 Separation Allowance, for men who were the sole support, and on whose account the dependents were drawing Separation Allowance.

With reference to the matter of Pension, I am to state that the Board of Pension Commissioners do not come within the jurisdiction of the Minister of Militia, and all matters pertaining to Pension have to be dealt with by them. Your communication has been forwarded to them, with a request that it be given early consideration and a reply sent to you direct.

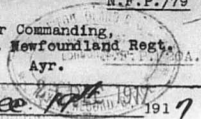
