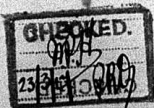

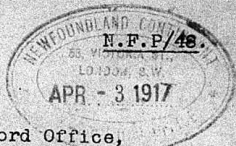

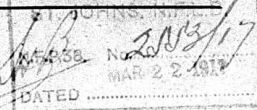

Please pardon me for thus intruding upon your valuable time. My excuse for so doing is that I am an ex-soldier, and up against hard times.

I served in Gallipoli, and France. In Gallipoli, during the big storm of Nov. 26th 1915, and the days following, I was badly frostbitten, and contracted rheumatism, from both of which I yet suffer. Now Sir, I was discharged

June 5th last year, and received not one cent pension. The board as I suppose deeming me as not being entitled (perhaps justly so.) tho' I will let the kind generosity of those in authority be my judge.

Since my discharge, I have been unable to follow my former occupation (line-man) and have taken up a homestead, as the best means of which I know to further the Nation's, and my own cause. Since leaving the service, I have done my utmost in securing recruits, and aiding in other matters as well.

I tell you candidly Sir, I am "up against it" hard and solid, and if I could get a pension, even for the first few months following my discharge I would be

would
indeed, very grateful, and it, partly at
least, help me out of the difficulty in
which I find myself.

Hoping Sir, that you may give my
humble appeal your kind consideration,
and generously overlook any faults
I may have been guilty of.

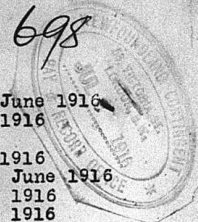

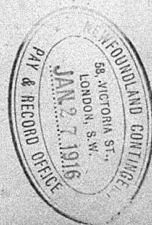
