

On June 30 - last I wrote to Mr. H. B. Clyde Lake, Minister of M. & F. R. who informed me that the matter had been passed over to you.

At the present writing I have had nothing further on the subject, and am desirous and eager to obtain an honorable discharge, as it helps in obtaining employment, and I feel I am entitled to same.

I served from May 1916 to the fall of 1918. My regimental no. was 7793. Rank - Private. I went overseas in August 1916, and during my service cannot recall any time that I was even called before orderly room except one time in Scotland I came in late, and my case was dismissed as it was my first and only time late. I have never tasted intoxicating liquor of any kind, and have never been convicted of any crime.

Unless our Military Records have been lost, I cannot conceive of any reason why my

request cannot be granted.

I feel sure that this matter has either not been brought to your attention, or that your other duties have been so pressing you haven't been able to take care of me.

Will you kindly favor me with a reply on this thing, so that the case can be disposed of.

I regret that I waited so long to get an honorable discharge, but at present am taking a semi-military course, and it's necessary for me to have something of my war record.

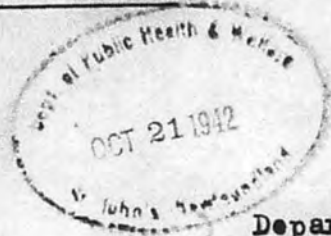
