In order for you to qualify for the grant of Separation Allowance during the period from the date of your marriage to the date of his discharge he should have allotted at least 50 per cent of his pay in your favour. As he failed to do so no action could be taken by this office except to represent your case to the Minister of Militia, by telegraph, which up to date has produced no results.

It is therefore felt that nothing further can be done by this office. Your marriage certificate and Character Certificate are returned as requested. Please acknowledge.
