Dear Hamilton:

I am in receipt of your letter of November 11th, forwarding a letter from the Pace Agency for Placements with reference to Lieut. Field. In answer to the questions put by the Pace Agency, I would state (1) The reason for his leaving his last civil position, that is, Bank Clerk, with the Bank of Nova Scotia, was to enlist which he did on April 1st 1916, and his reason for leaving the service on October 27th 1919 was that his services could be dispensed with and he was anxious to establish himself in civil life (2) I have pleasure in stating that his Military record for accuracy, persistence, and adaptability is very good. Field was under my command as a non-comm. assigned officer and as OQMS and later in this Department he was employed in the Pay Office under my control, and I can vouch for his qualifications in these three points (3) With reference to his capacity for resuming responsibility, I think that in every short time this phase of his character will be rather strongly marked. He was in charge of a sub-department in the Pay Office and handled his work well and with initiative (4) As Field's civil career up to the time of his enlistment was as a banker and his Military career also placed him in charge of accounts and figures, it would seem that almost any line of commercial life would be suitable for him to adopt.

As far as I am aware Field has no habits or peculiarities and there is nothing in his record either civil or Military that would in any degree affect his career that he chooses or which may be chosen for him.

I am returning the Pace Agency's letter and trust that the foregoing information will fill the requirements.
