

I beg to state that with reference to the first, the Riband has been mailed you to-day.

As to your Gratuity, I take it that you refer to the Separation Allowance due your wife on this account, and for your information I may say that the cause of delay has been that the Paymaster has been unable to find out whether or not your wife was receiving Separation Allowance prior to your discharge. However, the October cheque was overlooked, but it has been posted you to-day.


