It is my painful duty to inform you that a report was yesterday received from the War Office notifying the fatality which has overtaken No. 3272, Dominic Foaley, (at I am to express the deep sympathy of the Newfoundland Government at your irreparable loss.

Your brother died of wounds at the 61st Casualty Clearing Station, France, on the 18/8/17.

If articles or personal property of the late Private Foaley are found, they will be forwarded to this Office, but some little time may probably elapse before their receipt, and they will be naturally subject to customary formalities concerning effects.

Application regarding the disposal of personal effects or of any amount that may eventually be found due to the late Soldier's Estate should be addressed to this Office.

The matter of the estate of this soldier has been referred to the Deputy Minister of Justice, and in his reply he states that there is no doubt that his estate comes within the jurisdiction of the Newfoundland Court. The money is in the hands of the Department of the Government waiting to be paid out to his legal representative. The Govt will guarantee administration in due course.

The Deputy Minister of Justice advises that the money should remain at the Pay & Record Office until an effort has been made to get into communication with Stansloff Foley, brother of the deceased, and this effort will be made by the Department of Justice.

No further action is necessary therefore until further instructions are received from the Department of Justice.

Re Estate of #3272, Pte. D. Foley.

I have the honour to acknowledge receipt of yours of the 27th inst. in connection with the estate of the above noted soldier. I find from the records of this Department, sent here by the Pay & Record Office, that the next of kin of Private D. Foley is given as "Stansloff Foley, 1 Cove Street, Moscow, Russia," and the amount at his credit is \$62.47.

In reply to your question as to whether his estate should be considered as property in Newfoundland, I think there is no doubt that his estate comes within the jurisdiction of the Newfoundland Court. The money is in the hands of a Department of the Government waiting to be paid out to his legal representative. The Court will grant administration in due course. Before disposing of this money I think an effort should be made to ascertain if his given next of kin, his brother, is still in Moscow. Owing to the unsettled condition of Russia at the present time, and the prospects that its condition will remain unsettled for a long time yet, it may be difficult to get in touch with the brother of deceased. I would advise that the money should remain at the Pay & Record Office until an effort has been made to get in communication with Stansloff Foley. That will be done by this Department. We will send him the customary papers at the address given.

When the above noted soldier enlisted, the address of his next of kin was stated to be Russia, but no more definite address was given. The matter of settling his estate now has to be considered, and I should like your advice on this point

It would seem that the question to be decided is whether the estate should be considered as "property in Newfoundland" or otherwise. If so considered, it is presumed the amount in the absence of claims from the next of kin or other relative reverts to the Government of Newfoundland. If not so considered, should not the amount be advised to the Secretary, War Office for the purpose of adjustment? I should like to have your opinion.

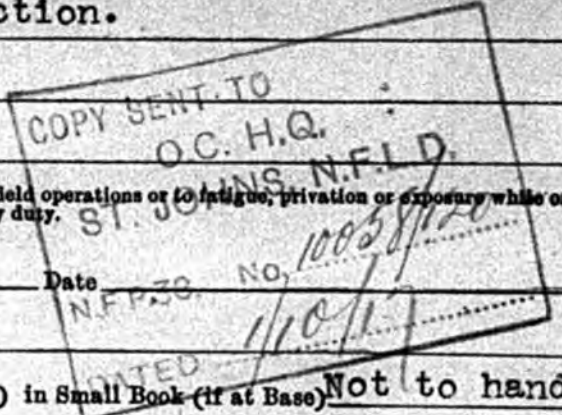

From her it is learned that Fealey stated that his father had died before he came to this country, and that his mother died when he had been here about three months. He had one brother who is supposed to have been killed while fighting with the Russian forces. Fealey was wounded in action, and later died of wounds. This Dept. is therefore unable to dispose of his war medals,

and it is requested that the instructions of the War Office may be obtained, please, in relation thereto. The only individual to whom they might be sent appears to be Mrs. Hollett, his landlady and friend. Otherwise, presumably, they must be retained with his army records, or returned to the War Office for disposal.


