My dear Mr. Bennett.

I am writing you in reference to a matter which has lately come under my notice, in the enlistment of one named John J. Foley, who went to St. John's recently, for examination for Military service.

This young man has I understand passed the necessary medical examination, and thereby has been accepted for the Army.

I think, if the authorities had known the facts of the case, this individual would have been rejected, on this ground that the young man in question, is the only support of a widowed mother. She has no one else to depend on, and at present is likely to become a burden on the parish, and on the community. She has no dependents whatsoever, and as far as I can learn, has no relatives who would be willing to do anything, towards her support, consequently as I say must become a burden on the community here. Of course if there was anyone at all whom she could depend on, the matter would not be as pressing as it is at present, and I just quote this circumstance, for your information, as I am sure, that under ordinary conditions, and considering the circumstances, he would have been rejected on the above grounds.

I can vouch for the truth of the above statements, as I have seen his mother, and altho she is not a member of the Roman Catholic Church, still she shall have to be an encumbrance on the district of Burin, as she is beyond an age, to do anything towards her own support, and he is the only member of her

family living.

Whilst not wishing to run counter to any regulations made by the Military authorities, I think if you would look into this case, you may be able to do something towards the release of this individual, on the grounds of the facts stated above.

I should be very glad to hear from you on this matter, and assuring you of the fact that whatever is done, by the authorities shall have my consent and approval.

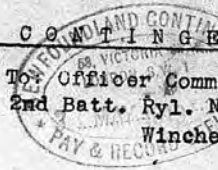


