Sir,

Before I left St. Peter's Rev. Mr. Perrett, Moscovian Missionary gave me the two enclosed Certificates and asked me to pass them on to the proper authorities.

The young men whom the Certificates are about volunteered their services for King and Country and as I'm at a loss as to what Branch of Service they are engaged in I'm forwarding them to you. If they have joined the Navy I'm sure you will soon understand and forward the Certificates to the proper person. This is something strange to me. I reckon <sup>Rev. Mr. Perrett</sup> has taken such steps because they are not very conversant with the English language. I'm under the impression if a few returned heroes were to visit the different settlements along the coast next summer or early next spring fifty or sixty recruits, probably more, would be

accused. The natives would make  
good Naval Reserve men. I fail to  
see why they would <sup>not</sup> make good soldiers  
as well. They are certainly good shots.

I believe if I were to go with a party  
of returned heroes to the different  
places - as they have me in their confidence  
grand results so far as recruiting goes  
would be experienced.

**OPINION OF THE MEDICAL BOARD.**
