Above noted man enlisted in April 1916 and made an allotment of 50/- in favour of his mother, whom he states was entirely dependant upon him for support. He states that owing to his lack of education he was not conversant with separation allowance regulations when they came into force, but made application for the allowance in the fall of 1918. The papers were sent from England to St John's, where the usual forms were sent his mother to fill in. Some delay was caused in returning same through waiting to get someone to guide her in filling out the forms, but eventually they were completed and returned.

He states that nothing has been heard as to whether the allowance was granted or not, but in the meantime his mother died in late November, 1918. Will you please advise Private Fry (the bearer) as to his position in this matter.

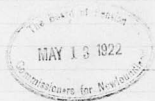

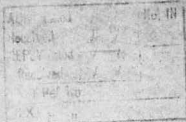

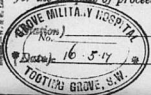
