He was on active service at the time he was wounded, that would be about 8th. or 9th. of December and he died January 11th which would leave a balance due in December and also a balance for January. The allotment which I received was only 30 cents per day, \$9.30 per month. I wrote the Deputy Paymaster here in Newfoundland to enquire about the matter for me but I received no reply from him. I am a poor hardworking man 57 years old and now my son is dead I am deprived of his support. I would be much obliged if you will please look the matter up for me in Record Office."

Non-effective account is now due to be forwarded to you, but owing to the unusual pressure of work and the number of non-effective accounts still outstanding from 1917, it will be impossible to have this forwarded immediately.

Noted.

We have had numerous letters from various persons - written by Mr. Furlong, in the same strain and all have been replied to.

It is noted that account was in course of preparation at the date of your memorandum, but same has not reached the Pay Office, here, at this writing.

Please expedite.

I am directed to acknowledge receipt of your letter of 25th March, in connection with money affairs relating to your son Pte. D. H. Furlong. The Secretary of the Pensions & Disabilities Board has been asked to render me a report of the case of this soldier showing how the matters now stand. I am forwarding you a copy of the letter received. The attached copy is a full explanation and I do not know that I can enlarge on it, but I would say that it does not seem that any undue harshness exists in your case, which is similar to so many others all through the Country.

The money which is at the credit of Pte. Furlong's account at the time of his decease will eventually be ordered to be paid to you when letters of Administration have been granted by the Department of Justice. As soon as any effects or belongings of this soldier are received by this department they will be at once forwarded to you.

It is noted in your letter that you state that the last allotment received by you was in December, cheques for \$9.30, and \$8.40, were forwarded on the 6th February, and 6th March, the cheque covering allotment for March, will be forwarded in a day or two.

Although a soldier signs for service for the duration of the war in no case does that mean that his pay should continue in the event of any soldier becoming deceased, in certain cases where it is shown that a deceased soldier has left dependents provision is

made



Sir,-

At your request, I have the honour to report as follows, concerning the case of L.J. Furlong of Bell Island.

#919 Private David J. Furlong originally declared an allotment of sixty cents per day, payable to his mother, and the allotment continued at this rate until December, 31st, 1916, when, at Pte. Furlong's own instruction, it was reduced to thirty cents per day and was paid by us to Mrs. Furlong at that rate regularly.

Pte. Furlong died of wounds on January, 14th, 1918, and pending final decision of the Pensions Board regarding the issue of Pension or otherwise in this case, the allotment is being continued under the arrangement by which the Pensions Board will be responsible for payments made during the period between a man's decease and the time that their decision, with regard to Pension for his dependents, is reached, the idea being, that the dependents are no worse off financially than when the son was alive.

This procedure has been explained as clearly as possible to Mr. Furlong several times.

As far as I understand, the Pensions & Disabilities Board do not care to deal with cases of this kind, as at the present time it is on the eve of going out of Office and prefers that far-reaching questions be decided by the duly appointed Pensions Commissioners.

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It will presumably therefore, be some time before the case is considered, but in the meantime, the same amount as before the son's death, is going to the family monthly.

I have not yet received statement of Pte. Furlong's final account from London Office, nor do I expect same for three or four months yet as the Paymaster has stated, that owing to the various sources from which information has to be obtained and the delay which, on account of the numbers of men involved, must be experienced, in obtaining such necessary information, an account cannot finally disposed of for at least six months after a soldier's decease.

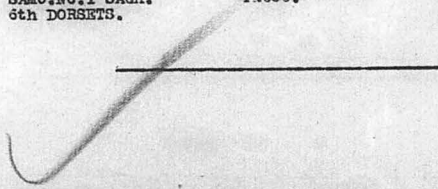
