Dear Sir,

Herewith I send you a letter from Mr. John Gallishaw, formerly of the Newfoundland Regiment, now residing at Boston, who is an applicant for a pension as the result of wounds sustained by him in Gallipoli.

His papers show that he "signed off" in England and went direct to the United States; but later he applied for a pension, and we sent papers away for him to have a medical examination. This was undertaken by Dr. Adams who had been at St. Anthony with Dr. Grenfell, and who put a rating on him for his disability three times as great as was being put on men with similar trouble under the Canadian system.

We therefore objected to this decision, and the Governor wrote to Dr. Adams asking him to revise it, but obtained no reply up to the time of his leaving here.

As Gallishaw was vigorously representing that he was being unfairly treated, and as his last letter was held in the office without reply during the time I was absent, I wrote him the annexed on my return and his reply, dated Nov. 3rd, I now beg to enclose.

You will notice that he makes some suggestions with regard to his coming here and doing Recruiting work, and before the Pensions Board takes up the further consideration of his case I will be glad if you will let us know whether it would be possible for you to use him in the capacity he suggests and whether you would be disposed to grant him the rank which he thinks he ought receive in connection therewith.

As early a reply as possible will be appreciated.

Sir:-

I beg to acknowledge receipt of your memorandum of March 20 covering personal letter to you from Dr. J. D. Adams, of Boston, re A. J. Gallishaw's claim for pension.

In reply to your request for an answer, I forward you the recent correspondence respecting the matter, from which you will see that Surgeon-Major MacPherson regards the rating put on Gallishaw as altogether too high, in which view we concur with ~~him~~ and we suggest that the paper be sent back with a view to have it reduced if the doctors in Boston can see their way clear to doing this. Certainly they are giving him unusually liberal treatment as compared with that received by others of our men from our own doctors here, who, however, are only applying the Canadian principle. While we are disposed to do everything possible for Mr. Gallishaw, we cannot, on the other hand, be parties to an injustice to other men.

Perhaps from this and the correspondence you will be able to frame a reply to Dr. Adams which will seem to you to meet the requirements.

Sir,- Re passage to St. John N.B.

On April 4th 1915, I enlisted with the Newfoundland Regiment at St. John's, Newfoundland. In August 1915 I embarked with the Battalion for active service, and on October 23rd was wounded. I came to Wandsworth Hospital on December 5th, and on the 18th. January was discharged from Hospital and sent to the Depot for disposal.

While in Hospital I was told by the Doctors that I would have to stay in Convalescent Home for six months. I wrote to the O.C. Depot asking him if, instead of so-doing, I could be discharged on this side in order to proceed to the United States to my relatives. In reply he wired that this could be arranged if I would waive repatriation. I wired authorising the Depot to proceed with my discharge on this basis. A few days ago while at the Depot I signed a paper confirming this.

At that time I understood that in waiving repatriation I merely released the Government from the responsibilities of sending me back to St. John's, Newfoundland. I thought I would be given a cash equivalent of the 3rd. Class passage to Newfoundland. Since then the Adjutant has told me that in waiving repatriation

repatriation I sacrificed all claim. I now write to  
ask you if, in consideration of my having<sup>signed</sup> the document,  
under a misapprehension, you could arrange to have  
my passage paid to St. John, N.B.



I am taking the liberty to write you to ask a favor for my mother.

At the present time she is very ill and we are under heavy expense. My brother has just secured an allowance from the Newfoundland Government, and Sir Patrick McBrath informed him that they would look favourably upon an application from mother for

a separation allowance covering the period that her son was at war. at the time mother was receiving \$100 per ~~month~~ year for her services at Murray's Pond Club House and had to support herself for eight months on that sum. My brother contributed all that he could, I was sick at the time and unable to work, my sister was married + of course could not help a great deal.

I have filled out the paper as best I could, but as mother is ill in bed it was impossible to have her swear to the paper before a lawyer or notary public.

I am writing to ask you to use your influence in securing this money for my mother. Her illness has cost a great deal, as she has been under the doctor's care for the past five months.

I hope I am not asking too much from you, but now that the elections are over I presume things have quietened down some -

my daughter, who was at that time very ill. He joined up with the Canadian Forces in October 1914, but wishing to serve with his own countrymen he purchased his discharge, returned to Newfoundland, and joined the Regiment. While he was in the Canadian Regiment I received a separation allowance of \$20 per month, which allowance my son believed would be continued while he served with the Newfoundland Regiment.
