Dear Sir:-

With reference to the matter of your brother's wound, of which you spoke to me Saturday, I would say that I took the matter up with Dr. MacPherson, Secretary of our Standing Medical Board, during that afternoon, and we went over, together, the papers of your brother's examination in England and also here.

Dr. MacPherson points out that although your brother was wounded, he had recovered from the wound, and the only disability for which he was invalided back here was that due to typhoid, and the conclusion reached by the English Medical Board of three doctors in regard to this matter was

"His capacity for earning a full living
"has not been lessened from a physical
"point of view, in any way."

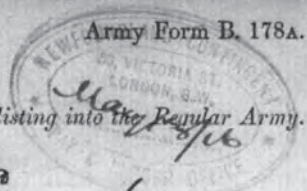
Our medical Board in turn endorsed on the paper that they "concur with above finding" and this in turn is approved by Major MacPherson as administrative medical officer. Under these circumstances it will be impossible for me to do anything further in regard to your brother's case unless he makes a formal application in writing setting forth the reasons which in his judgment would call for any other procedure on our part, and on receipt of this I will lay it before the Medical Board.

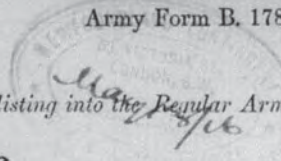

NOTES.—(i.) Clear and decisive answers to the following questions are to be carefully filled in by the Board, as in the event of the man being invalided, it is essential that the Commissioners of Chelsea Hospital should be in possession of the most reliable information to enable them to decide upon the man's claim to pension.

- (ii.) Expressions such as "may," "might," "probably," &c., should be avoided.
- (iii.) The rates of pension vary directly according to whether the disability is attributed to (a) active service, (b) climate, or (c) ordinary military service. It is therefore essential when assigning the cause of the disability to differentiate between them (see Articles 1162 and 1165, Pay Warrant, 1913).

Dear Mr. Garland,

I have your note of this day's date regarding the W.S.M. messages. Mr. Stirling was quite correct when he told you that they had discontinued such messages and that the Governor had instructed Captain Timewell to send information about casualties, progress of the sick and other matters as soon as received by him. Any W.S.M. messages, that have been sent since that arrangement, applied only to those who were in England, and such messages only were transmitted free of charge. We found that some messages which we sent W.S.M. respecting our boys in Egypt or in the Dardanelles, were not only fruitless in result, but we had to pay heavily for them for the transmission from England out to the East. It became therefore practically impossible to continue that, for the cost was great, and in very few instances did we have any result. It is difficult to tell what to do because we do not know where the boys are. A W.S.M. to Captain Timewell would necessitate his sending the messages to the East in order to find out where George is. He would not know this until his progress sheets had been received, and he would then wire to us at once. I trust that George is not seriously injured, and that we shall soon have news about him. It must be a time of great anxiety to you all.
