I note what you say in both your letters to me April 6. th. I was certainly somewhat put out to think after Doctor Smith and also Major MacDonald of the 94 th Medical Co. promising to take Gibben huck and put him in hospital where he would have proper treatment, but they both say now that they cannot get him in here and cannot send him to Halifax without orders from Ottawa. he has been treating himself all the time with the medicine that Doctor Smith gave him but he does not get the care he would have if he was in hospital. I do all I can for him he spends most of his time down in the Office with me where I try and encourage him and help keep his spirits up. he is a Goodnatured fellow. and I do feel for him. I had to get him more cloths with what I gave him last Week. I trust this will be O.K. with all good wishes.

Your letter of 8th inst., with reference to Pte. Gibbenhuck addressed to Major Carty, has been passed along to me. I appreciate the interest you have taken in this matter, and for your private information will give you the following information in connection with the case.

He was one of a draft returned from England in charge of Lt. L.C. Murphy. I received a telegram from Lt. Murphy in North Sydney advising that this man was very ill of the disease mentioned, and asking for instructions. I sent him the following telegram: "Recommend retention and treatment North Sydney arrange through Military Medical authorities." I heard nothing more of the case until after the arrival of the draft, and on asking for a report from Lt. Murphy, was informed that the man had been left to the care of Dr. T.H. Smith, who had promised to look after him. Some days after this I received a letter from Mr. Shano who acts as our agent in North Sydney, advising me that he was not in hospital. I immediately sent a telegram to Mr. Shano on April 6th, the day his letter was received, as follows:- "Gibbenhuck if he is not being treated in hospital instruct Dr. Smith to hand him over to the Military Authorities for hospital treatment" and received his reply as follows: "Have arranged for Major McDonald to take full charge of Gibbenhuck he will enter Ross hospital to-morrow just left him says he is glad to go and will soon I trust be glad to go home Major says he will do his best to help him through."

You will thus see that the matter is now in order. I do not know why my original instructions were not carried out. Possibly this could not be arranged at the time by Lt. Murphy. I have asked him for a report on the circumstances.

You will see from the above that everything was done from this end to have the case given the best attention. We were not aware that the man was not in hospital until we received Mr. Shano's letter, April 6th.

Dear Sir,

I received your telegram in connection with the draft, and have since been advised of their safe arrival at Halifax.

With reference to the soldier left behind at North Sydney by Lieut. Murphy. I am informed that he was placed under the care of Dr. Smith, and as soon as he is released from hospital, and is fit to travel, he should be returned to St. John's.

It is advisable that no money should be advanced to him, except under the instructions of the doctor in charge of the case, and only for immediate necessities. This is a matter that will be solely at the discretion of the Doctor, as it is considered that while in hospital he will not be in need of funds except for necessary requirements.
