Dear Sirs:

Upon the 31st ult. we wrote you on behalf of Francis Glynn bringing to your notice the case of his son Frank J. Glynn who is at present a private in the Royal Newfoundland Regiment. Glynn has been engaged as a diver in connection with salvage operations on the West Coast; the work is of a rather urgent character and he is unable to obtain any person to take the place of his son in looking after the pumps etc. when he is below water. The services of his son F.J. Glynn whom he has specially trained for this work are absolutely ^{necessary} for two months during this season. If the Board would grant two months leave of absence to his son Glynn would be able to proceed with his work and trade interests generally would benefit.

There is but one other diver in the country, Mr. Taylor, and it is not possible for him to attend to all the work that offers.

We shall be glad if you will kindly give this matter your earnest consideration.

Dear Sirs:

Further referring to matter of exemption of Private Frank J. Glynn, we beg to point out that his father has been employed by the Dominion Iron and Steel Company to perform certain diving work in St George's Bay, and that in order to carry out this work, he is compelled to get a short leave of absence from Bowring Bros. Ltd. for a married son of his who is employed by that Company. His married son cannot afford to give up his present employment to assist the father in his work, because work of the kind is only done at certain seasons of the year. If it were possible for the Board to grant a leave of absence, say, for a period of two months to Private Glynn, it would enable the father to do the work now offering and for which he went to considerable expense to fit himself to perform.

The favour of an answer will be esteemed.

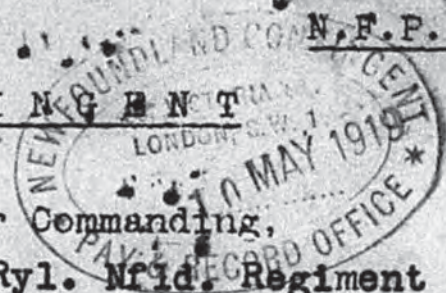

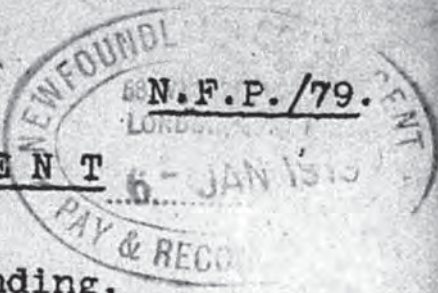
