Sir,-

I take the liberty of calling your attention to the fact that in the matter of war service gratuity I have not been treated with that consideration which I feel my case warrants, and may I present the following facts for your information and, I trust, your kind consideration.

1917
1918
I offered my services and was accepted on November 15th 1918, but owing to the Fall's rush of work could not report for duty until January 12th 1918. Recruiting was very slack at the time, and I was detailed to conduct a publicity campaign in conjunction with the A.D.R. When this and the efforts of the returned soldiers culminated in general conscription becoming law I was detailed to the Military Service Board as chief clerk to inaugurate a system of registration etc. Despite frequent requests for draft to the D.O.C., I was kept in this department until the signing of the Armistice - when I was demobilised after nearly a year's service and over a twelve months' actual enlistment.

I beg to submit that in the matter of gratuity I have



been put in the class of those men who were forced to join up during the two months or so immediately preceding the Armistice, and through no fault of my own thus forfeited the gratuity I would otherwise be entitled to had my requests been granted to be allowed to proceed overseas.

On receiving your discharge from The Royal Newfoundland Regiment in consequence of demobilisation, I wish to place on record my appreciation of the work performed by you, while attached to the Office of the Registrar. During this period you have performed the duties of the Chief Clerk with faithfulness and efficiency and have displayed executive ability of a high order.

I regret that it was not found possible to comply with your desire to proceed Overseas and that you were prevented from taking your place in the firing line and participating in the final stages of the conflict.

I wish to make it clear, however, that the work which you were called upon to perform here in the cause of King and Country was, because of your special aptitude for same, of greater importance than you could have performed in the firing line and assisted just as effectively in winning the day as that performed by your comrades Overseas.

I respectfully beg to approach you regarding my present standing in the Regiment.


I enlisted last November after three unsuccessful previous attempts (being the 84th man to enroll when the Regiment was formed) but was given leave of absence until the end of the business year - January 15th.

When about ready to proceed overseas in March I was detailed by you to work in conjunction with the A.D.R in the publicity campaign of the big recruiting drive just then inaugurated. When this resulted in Conscription I was again detailed to the Military Service Board - being promoted on May 21st to Corporal to "acting-Sergeant while attached to Department of Militia!"

Some of the men with whom I was in training, are now on various courses in England qualifying for rank; and I trust I may be pardoned for pointing out that in my present position I am being retarded from receiving the promotion which I feel my length of service and the practical knowledge of drill acquired during that period, would entitle me to.

Descriptive Return of a Soldier Discharged on Account of Disability.

Dear Sir:-

I acknowledge receipt of your letter of June 14th, concerning the application of Mr. P. Grace for Staff Pay.

Mr. Grace's position is that he was employed on the staff of the Military Service Board. The Military Service Board was operating under the Department of Justice, and not under this Department, and therefore he and the others on that staff could not be considered as part of the staff of this Department. The Regulations allowing Staff Pay covered only employees of this Office. The Orderly Room, as you are aware, although doing clerical work at the Depot, were not entitled to this Staff Pay, until demobilisation was ordered, and the Depot was graded as a Discharge Depot, when the staff became eligible for staff rates of pay.

It is understood that Mr. Grace received a sum of, I believe, \$200.00 from the Military Service Board on his discharge; and that point, too, tends to show that the Military Service Board realized that he was doing work of an exceptional nature, for which the higher rates of staff pay were not issuable.

It is regretted that no authority exists for the payment of Staff Pay to Mr. Grace; and it would appear that in order for him to secure Staff Pay, it would be necessary to amend existing regulations, or to pass a new Regulation covering the staff of the Military Service Board.
