STATEMENT OF PRISONER OF WAR

St. Heratic Grouchy - Pouch Cove.

September 1915. Proceeded Overseas - March 1916

Company - France - "C" Company

Place & Date of Capture - Monchy-le-Preaux. April 14th, 1917

Circumstances of Capture - During the attack my company was reduced to a very small number and those of us who were left were scattered about in shell-holes. When the Germans broke through on our left we found ourselves completely surrounded and considerably outnumbered and so were forced to be taken prisoners.

Details of Life & Treatment under Capture - I was sent to Douai and was taken before four officers, one of whom spoke good English. I was treated very kindly at first and then they commenced to ask me questions trying to get information from me concerning our troops. I gave them wrong answers in every case and when they found out I was not telling them anything, their attitude changed. I was made to stand at attention for some time whilst they continued their examination, and finally one of the officers got angry because I refused to impart any information and struck me in the face unawares knocking me down. I was then actually kicked out of the room into another close by and locked in and kept there for two days. Then I was sent to Port McDonald, Lille for about a week. This was really another "Black Hole of Calcutta" and the treatment here was awful. The room was dark, cold and damp and built of stone, and we were all herded together in there nearly 200 all told N.C.O's and privates together. The only window was bricked up the day before we arrived, and a small hole about a foot square was left at the top. We were given a small portion of black bread and a mouthful of salty soup once a day. We were not allowed any water to drink, much as we craved for it. The stench in the room was almost unbearable as a barrel was kept in a corner for use as a latrine. This was emptied every second day with buckets, and nuisance was slopped all over the floor. We had no blankets or great coats and had to lie on the stone floor wherever we could. We drank our small portion of salty soup out of our steel helmets, and the Germans used to congregate outside outside our window with their ration of beer and taunt us. After a couple of days some of our men were almost crazy with thirst and general weakness after the battle, and at the end of a week some of them could hardly stand. Complaints were useless as they were entirely disregarded. Their argument was that their prisoners were treated in the same way and we were being held as prisoners of reprisals. Then we were sorted out in drafts and sent up to work behind the German Lines and under our own shellfire. I was sent to Marquion for about 2 1/2 months and I can say the same about the general treatment here as all the others have said. My next move was to Desmain until September. Except for the food which was as bad and scarce as before, the treatment improved a little as we were given a blanket, and a bath, and a bowl to drink out of. I was then shifted to Germany and arrived at Friedericksville and remained ~~there~~ there for 3 months. Here the N.C.O's and privates were separated and from that time on I did not have to do any work as I had done previously though we N.C.O's were continually being urged to volunteer to do manual labour. But we found out that N.C.O's were not supposed to work and so we stuck out and refused. The treatment on the whole was not so bad under the circumstances, because our food parcels from the Red Cross began to arrive and we were practically independent of the German rations. Just before Xmas I was sent away to Parchim for about two months. It was very cold and miserable there, and we did not get our parcels for a month and a half on account of our change of address. We were not allowed any fires or lights in our Hut and they still badgered us to volunteer for work. We had to parade daily and stand in the snow until we were almost frozen without any opportunity of thawing ourselves out afterwards. We appealed to be sent to N.C.O's camp only and about the end of February we were shifted to Gurgurth where we were told there was a camp fitted up for N.C.O's only. We arrived there we discovered that the so-called camp was one that had been used previously for Russian prisoners and condemned as unfit for habitation in 1915. We were to make the best of it here and were kept in this during the winter stay in Germany. However, our food parcels did not come up regularly and we were determined to stick it out. I was repatriated at Leith on December 26th, 1919.

DECLARATION
TO THE ENGLISH PRISONERS OF RESPITE

To the German request to withdraw the German Prisoners of War to a distance of not less than 30 kilometres from the front line the British Government has not replied.

Therefore, it has been decided that all Prisoners of War taken in future will be kept as Prisoners of Respite - i.e. very short of food bad lodging, no beds, hard work (as well as beside the German guns under shell-fire) no pay, no soap for washing and shaving, no baths, no towels or boots.

The English Prisoners of Respite are allowed to write to their relations or persons of influence in England how badly they are treated, and that no alteration in the ill-treatment will occur until the English Government has consented to the German request.

It is, therefore, in the interest of all English Prisoners of Respite to do their best to enable the German Government to remove all English Prisoners of Respite to camps in Germany, where they will be properly treated - with good food, good clothing etc.

You will succeed by writing as mentioned above and surely the English Government will consent to Germany's request for the sake of their own countrymen.

You will be supplied with Post Cards, papers and envelopes. All your correspondence in which you explain your hardships will be sent as Express Mail to England.



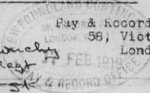
