Date and Place of Capture: Monchy-le/Preux, April 14th, 1917.

CIRCUMSTANCES OF CAPTURE: When we got to the top of the ridge, we dug in as best we could. The Germans in their counter-attack broke through the Essex on our left and we found ourselves surrounded, and all our ammunition gone.

DETAILS OF LIFE AND TREATMENT UNDER CAPTURE: I was captured with 2797 Pte. W. Masters and we were sent off to work together the whole time until we got to Schneidmuhl, when we were sent off to work on different farms, and my story coincides with his up to that time.

I worked on the farm from January, 1918, to October, 1918, and was treated fairly decently. Then I was sent to an Officers' Camp at Stralsend until December. I had to help the English Doctor there to bandage wounded officers.

I was repatriated to England via Denmark and arrived in Leith on December 18th.


Dear Sir Edward:-

DETAILS OF LIFE AND TREATMENT UNDER CAPTURE: I was captured with 2797 Pte. W. Masters and we were together the whole time until we got to Schneidmuhl, when we were sent off to work on different farms, and my story coincides with his up to that time.

I worked on the farm from January, 1918, to October, 1918, and was treated fairly decently. Then I was sent to an officer's camp at Stralsend until December. I had to help the English Doctor there to bandage wounded officers.

I was repatriated to England via Denmark and arrived in Leith on December 18th.

Just a few remarks in regard to my food and clothing parcels which is sent through the red Cross. I get my parcels sent me from Altdamm, which you know is my adress, the condition of the Parcels after it is censor at Altdamm by the help of our countrymen and I receive them in poor condition, tea soap, rice, sugar, taken out also exchange of tins of meat for tins of cabbage and potatoes, the last three clothing parcels I received ~~one, two,~~ three, seven articles were short, things I needed badly, I am with a party of seven men, and all our parcels get treated with the way I have described it. We Haven't received any tea for a month. The last seven grocery parcels that I received I was lucky enough to get one packet of tea, soap is out of the question, tobacco and cigarette parcels I get none, the last tobacco and cigarette parcel I received was dated Dec. 1917, the cig. parcel should contain 240 Lloyds gold flake, I received 90. I know the Red Cross is still sending me tobacco and cigarette parcels but some other is enjoying them. Things would not be so if the Officer in charge of the camp knew anything about it, kindly see into the matter
