At that time all his allotment was sent to him from the Office since his death October 9th. After waiting a time his effects were returned to me, only a torn and much delapidated pocket-book containing a few Postal Cards—that was all his effects I received, this was three weeks ago, and I have heard nothing from the Record Office since.



I have the honour to bring to your notice for reconsideration, the case of the mother of the above mentioned soldier. Mrs Gorman the mother, states that she has one son who is married and one who is a cripple. The latter is doing work as Government telegraph operator. Mrs Gorman's second husband is dead. She claims that the cripple son is earning only enough to support himself, and the Sergeant who was killed in action on the 9th of October 1917, was her sole support. The records show that Sgt. Hannon's allotment of 55 cents per day, was cancelled on the 30th of April 1917, and it is understood that pension was not considered because of this fact, but a reconsideration of the case is requested please.



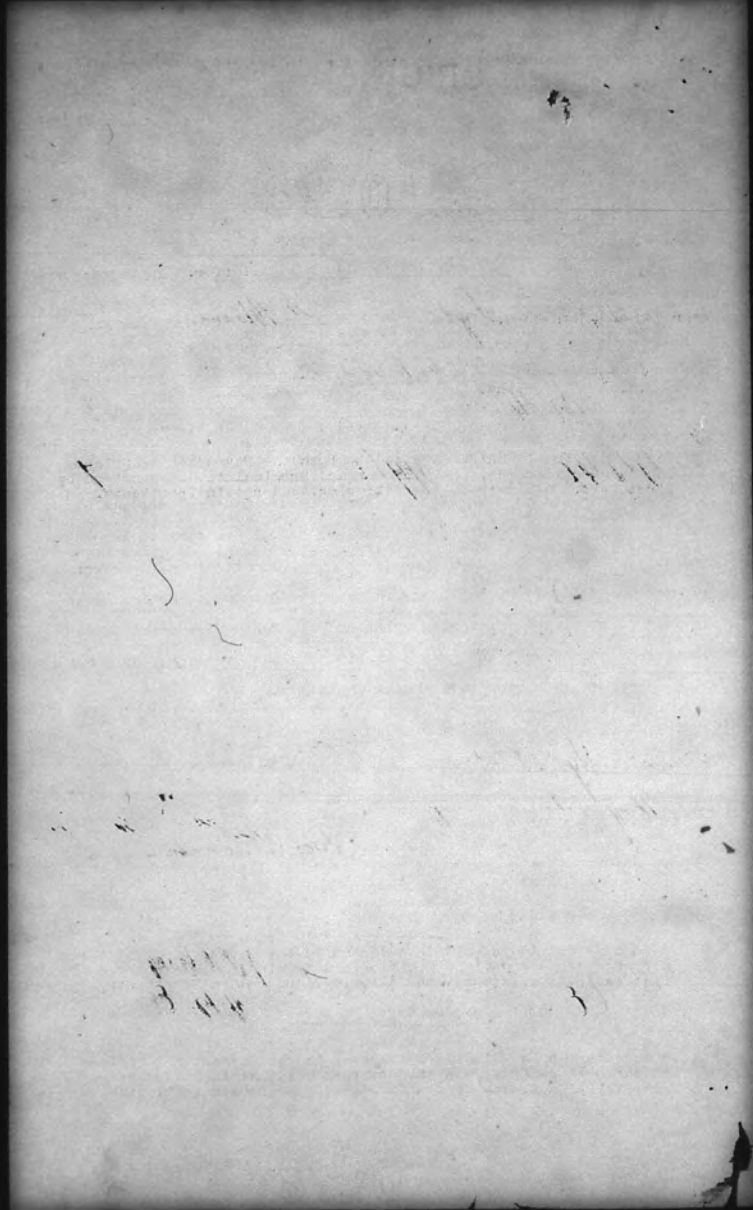
