Having received a letter from Brookes this morning that you have a vacancy in the Pay Office, I beg to advise you that I am now receiving massage to both legs, but if you are wanting the vacancy filled immediately I could apply for my discharge from Hospital, and also to receive balance of treatment as an Out patient at Wandsworth where I could go for same after office hours each evening until completion of treatment. I did not write to you as I was not certain when I was getting clear from Hospital, as I understood from you not to write until I was sure of what category I was placed in. If the vacancy is still open I could start next Tuesday or thereabouts and if you sanction same take my leave when the weather gets warmer. I am glad to inform^{you} that I am still

progressing most favourably but the Doctor tells me that my legs are still very much under normal size, and one is two inches smaller where the wound is, than the other leg.

I am in a very comfortable home here and Mrs Disney who owns the House acts as Sister. She has a brother in the War Office, Major Congreve whom you will probably have met.

I have the honour to enclose herewith a copy of a report of a Medical Board held on the above named pensioner at Cheltenham Terrace, on 13th January 1923.

As a result of this examination the Board assessed the disablement on account of dysentery and Gun-Shot wound left thigh at the rate of less than 20%, namely 1% to 5%, temporary for less than a year, then 1% to 5% of indeterminate duration. No treatment was indicated by the Board and re-examination was not advised.

Mr. Hartley's pension expired on 29th December last and it is requested that further instructions may be transmitted.


