With further reference to your application for Separation Allowance, I have been directed to inform you that same cannot be granted, because in the period for which the Allowance is claimed, you had three single sons of Military Age, only one of whom enlisted for Overseas services; and the Regulations provide that where a widowed mother has three or more <sup>singl</sup> sons, she will be entitled to the Allowance when the third son enlists. The Regulation<sup>s</sup> is quite clear on this point, and it cannot be <sup>applied</sup> ~~part~~ from.



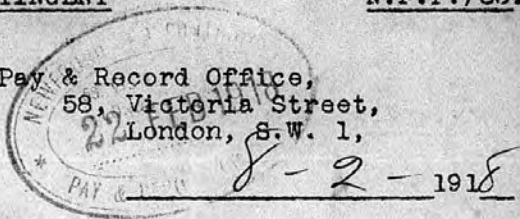
