



Circumstances of Capture - Our company had dwindled down to about 16 men and we were scattered about in shell holes. When the Germans broke through the Essex on our left they came up behind us and we found ourselves completely surrounded, and we were taken prisoners.

Details of Life and Treatment under Capture- After a few days in Douai and Fort McDonald, Lille, I was sent to Guesnain for about two months where our party was put to work on the railroads. There were 320 of us and we were billeted in a half finished house which could only properly accommodate 200, and we had to squeeze in where we could, and where without blankets or greatcoats, while the food was very scarce, and the work hard. Then we were shifted to Maichiennes for about five months where we had to work in the saw-mills and in the woods. The treatment here was about the same though the summer weather was less trying. We did not get any change of underclothing until some time in August, though we were able to get a wash occasionally. Then we were moved into Germany to Fredericksville, from whence after 14 days we went to Pafchim in Meiklenberg for 5 days. We were moved again to Lenföhren near Hamburg where we stayed till the armistice was signed. We were employed in cutting pit-props all the time. After the first month our parcels from the Red Cross began to arrive fairly regularly, and then things weren't so bad. I was repatriated via Aarosen in Denmark and arrived in Leith on Christmas Day.

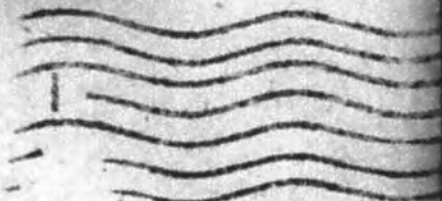
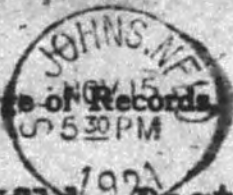

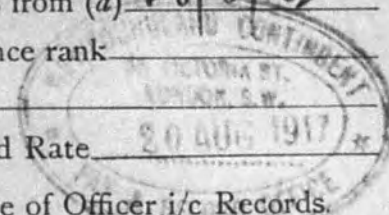
