

Dear Dr. Bond,

I have your note in relation to the breaking of the news of Lieut. Arthur Herder's death to the family. We, ourselves, were not aware of the miscarriage of the arrangements we had made until sometime afterwards. The facts are as follows:- On the evening that the news came in Mrs. Herder was up at the College, while Mr. Herder was at the Masonic Club. The two Herder boys were working at the Telegram Office and Mr. Martin, one of their employees, came up to this office. After we had communicated with you we rang up Mr. Atkinson, and Mr. Martin arranged that he would send a cab for Mr. Atkinson. The two Herder boys, however, seeing that their parents were both out, decided that they had better go to them and get them home, and that as this could not be done without alarming them, thought it better that they should break the news in each case, so that the services of the clergyman for that purpose were not required. In their excited state I presume they forgot all about telephoning to Mr. Atkinson of the change in plans, and as they had agreed to send the cab, under the new circumstances no cab went to Mr. Atkinson's house. One of the boys then went to the Masonic Club and informed the father, while the other went to the College Hall. The matter was, therefore, taken out of our hands, and under the circumstances I do not know whether anything better could have been done. It was unfortunate that

both

both parents were away from home, and while I do not know just what the boys said or how they acted, yet the very fact of being taken home without knowing why would have caused such anguish and suspense that really the knowledge of the fact could not have caused more.

Your will thus see from the above that this office was not to blame, if any blame attached in the matter.

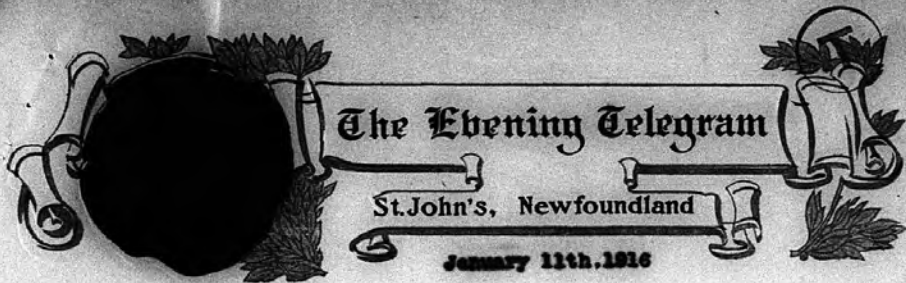

Mrs Arthur J. Herder, Lynwood, Ayr, has asked me as a personal friend of herself and of her late husband to write to you on her behalf regarding the death of her husband on 1<sup>st</sup> inst from wounds received in action.

The deceased advised his wife some time ago that in the event of anything happening to him or of her being in need of advice regarding matters arising out of his service with the Newfoundland Regiment she should communicate with you as his friend and act as you might advise.

You will recollect that Mrs Herder was introduced to you in July last by the deceased's brother Ralph.

The deceased left a Will bequeathing his whole estate and effects to his wife.

Mrs Herder wishes to know

(1) what she must do in order to obtain her husband's personal effects. She is particularly anxious to get, if possible, his rings, trinkets, watch, and bank pass-book. The pass book may be in the hands of deceased's bankers.

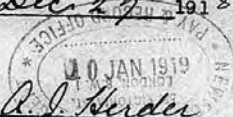

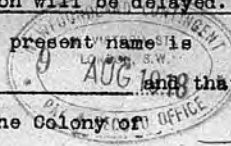

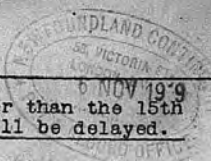
