Sir,

I have the honour to acknowledge receipt of yours of the 25th ultimo, addressed to the Minister of Justice, enclosing application for separation allowance signed by Mrs. William Hiscock, together with letter dated January 31st, 1919, from Mr. James Doyle, J.P., Doyle's Station.

Apparently the application was altered after it was sworn to by Mrs. Hiscock before Mr. Doyle, but the alteration states that Mr. Hiscock, husband of the applicant, has been crippled for the last eight years and only able to do light work.

This appears to be a medical certificate signed by Dr. Whelan, who resides at Searston, St. George's, and if it is a fact, it would be useless to take any proceedings against the man's wife for making a forged application.

It appears to me that it is a matter for your Department to deal with and not for the Department of Justice.

I am returning the application and Mr. Doyle's letter herewith.
