Sir:-

Thanks for your memo in connection with this man. As far as I am aware it is unusual on the other side for a Medical Board to grant any period of extended sick furlough.

When a patient is ready for discharge from Hospital, if further attention or rest is considered necessary, he is sent to a convalescent home until he is in a condition to report to the command depot or his reserve unit, when a period of nine or ten days furlough is granted to him, not because of health requirements, but as a recognition of his services.

The main objection to giving a man an extended period of sick furlough is, that it leaves him entirely on his own resources, and free from supervision of any kind. As such furlough would only be recommended where the man is considered unfit for any duty, it would seem advisable that his case should be handled so that he would be responsible to some authority while off duty for the period in question. He would then report to the competent Military authority, who would deal with his case in accordance with the findings of the board.

If it were considered unnecessary for him to become a patient in a convalescent home, he might be classified as an out-patient, and allowed to go to his own home, under the direction of and responsible to the proper Military Medical authority.

The matter of course, is an essentially ^a medical one, and it would not be proper for me to other than suggest the various solutions except in the interests of discipline.

I consider that the logical proceeding would be, for the man to pass under the control of the D.M.S. who would handle the case as considered proper under the finding of the Standing Medical Board.

NOTES.—(i.)
