



It is my painful duty to inform you that a report has to-day been received from the War Office notifying the implied fatality which, it is understood, has overtaken Lieut. R.P. Holloway of the 1st Newfoundland Regiment, and which has been conveyed to you by telegram in accordance with custom; and I am to express the deep sympathy and regret of the Newfoundland Government.

The report so far received reads:

"Lieut. R.P. Holloway, Missing believed Killed, 14/4/17."

As there is a possibility of Lieut. Holloway being a Prisoner, and in the absence of evidence establishing his death, the report must at present be regarded for what it implies.

I much regret the grave apprehension on your part to which this communication must give rise, but it is my duty to explain the position to you pending a further report from the War Office, which will be duly conveyed to you when received.

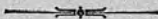

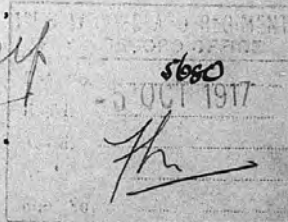

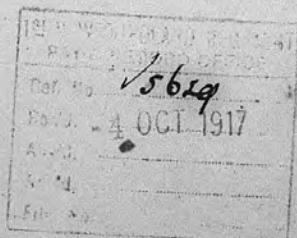
