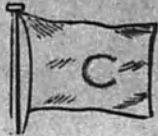

Dear Sir:

I acknowledge receipt of your letter of April 22nd concerning the repatriation of No. 5997, Pte. Paik. Howard.

It was hoped that a draft consisting of a large measure of fishermen would be returned to this country about the end of this month, but it was found impossible to arrange for the necessary accommodations owing to the fact that the shipping companies refuse to allow their ships to come this way whilst there is a possibility of ice conditions on the coast. At the present it is not possible to make arrangements for a draft to leave before about the 20th of May. Although this will not be quite as satisfactory as could be hoped, it is unfortunately the best that can be done.
