N.F.K. 46 dated 22/6/15 states: "Commence 15th May." This is obviously impracticable.

As frequently pointed out, time must be allowed for notifications to reach St. John's and to become operative.

In the present instance the next mail is due to go out at 7 a.m. 2nd prox., and the notification may reach St. John's in time to effect the required amendment as from 1st July, but this cannot be guaranteed during these times of transit of mails, direct ones being few and far between, consequently at best the old Allotment presumably will be acted upon until the 30th June.

n As also frequently mentioned in correspondence with you on these matters, Headquarters, St. John's, pay out on a Calendar Month basis.

With regard to Hynes' wish to withdraw his balance from the Bank, and the payment thereof to his brother; this is a matter outside the province of the Pay Department, their duty is to pay in, not draw out. Hynes should write direct to the Manager of the Bank of Montreal, St. John's, and notify his wishes, and at the same time of course notify the beneficiary.

I am forwarding Hynes' request 1/5/15 with the Allotment, together with a copy of this memorandum. Presumably the Deputy Paymaster will be able to arrange the matter, but that cannot be guaranteed. The position should be explained to Hynes, and in order to prevent delay he should communicate in manner indicated to obviate possible question and delay.

Further, please notify Hynes' Company Commander that approvals should be signed in full, initials are not sufficient; and the man should state his Regimental Number, also requests should be made in duplicate.

Please particularly commend to Company Commanders the necessity of attention to the salient aspects of cases of this nature. Hynes' request is dated 1/5/15, the amended Allotment 22/6/15, and I receive this on the 25/6/15 after departure of current mail. If this is done a great deal of trouble and references should be avoided by all concerned. In this connection I may say I have read with interest your reply to my No. 250, and concur with your references therein.

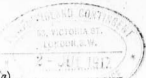

For some time past the Imperial Government have been making enquiries in relation to those men of the First Newfoundland Regiment who have been reported missing since the action of the 1st July. I very much regret to state, however, that from the correspondence which has taken place, a copy of which I enclose, it is evident that none of them are Prisoners of War in Germany, and the authorities are, therefore, reluctantly forced to the conclusion that all these gallant men, whose names are given in the enclosed list, and one of whom was very dear to you, were killed in that fateful action on the 1st of July.

I desire to express to you on behalf of the Government, as well as for myself, the sincerest sympathy in this time of sorrow. We feel the loss of our loved ones, but it will, no doubt, be some consolation to you to think that he, for whom you now mourn, willingly answered the call of King and Country, did his part nobly, and fell, facing the foe, in defence of the principles of Righteousness, Truth and Liberty. Though he has laid down the earthly weapons of warfare, he now wears the Soldier's Crown of Victory, and his name will be inscribed upon the Glorious Roll of Honor, and be held in fragrant memory by all his fellow-countrymen. When the victory is won, and Peace again reigns upon the earth, it will be a comforting thought to you that in this glorious achievement he bore no small part.

I trust that you may have the Grace and consolation of the Great Father of us all at this time.
