if it is made payable to a parent; and his case is then
considered by the Pension Commissioners, and if the depend-

ceases, and his account adjusted from the time of his
deahh, and pension continues to be paid. Your allot-
ment was paid from July 1st, 1916 until Feb 28th, 1919,
