I beg to acknowledge receipt of your letter of the 19th inst. having reference to an application to be made by you for Separation Allowance on account of your son, Pte. Heber Jones, who is a Prisoner of War in Germany.

The conditions under which Separation Allowances are granted are: that the person making application must be entirely dependant on the soldier for his or her support. If such is the case have the enclosed form filled out by some competent authority, such as the Rev. Mr. Legge, or Mr. Belbin, and duly signed and certified, then send same to me and I shall have the matter brought up for the consideration of the proper authorities.

Sir:-

My youngest Private Peter Jones  
No 2783, who was the chief support of myself and of  
my aged and invalid husband, joined the Royal  
Nfld Regiment about two years ago and is now held  
as a prisoner of war in Germany, having been taken  
prisoner about 16 months ago (April 1917). At the  
time of his leaving here he allotted to me the sum of  
Sixty cents per day to assist in our support. As my  
husband is not strong enough to earn much besides,  
and as my other two sons have enough to do to earn  
for themselves, we find it difficult at times, in  
sustaining the increased cost of living, to get along.

It is only recently that we heard that there was  
such a thing as a separation allowance given to those  
whose way carpers have been taken from them.

We would like to know therefore if it is possible  
for us to obtain any assistance from that source.

We refer you to the Rev W. L. S. Rees of Philips, who  
will explain you as to the matter. We also state that you  
shall be glad if you will kindly let us know if anything  
can be done for us as soon as possible.

Company in France - "G" Company.

Place & Date of Capture - Monchy-le-Preux, April 14th, 1917.

Circumstances of Capture - While advancing on the enemy on the morning of April 14th, 1917 my company was completely surrounded and being short of ammunition there was nothing left to do but give in. When taken our company was all spread out so we were captured in small and large groups. I was taken with about four Newfoundlanders.

Details of Life & Treatment while under Capture - I was taken about 10 a.m. on the morning of April 14th and sent to a small Village behind the lines where we remained for three days, after which we were marched to Lille and confined in a Fort, here about forty men were put in one room which was much to many for its size, remained here three days Our food for that time consisted of one slice of bread and cold coffee for breakfast and dinner, and for tea we received a drop of soup, While here we received very rough treatment at the hands of the German Soldiers After leaving Lille we were marched to Denain where we were quartered in a house in the town, we were put to work here building dugouts for German Officers and also worked at building ammunition dumps. The food here was much the same as that received by us at Lille, remained in Denain four days months. Our next move was to Sniderville where we were put in a prison camp, here we get 2 slices of bread for breakfast and dinner, and soup for tea, and slept in bunks which we made ourselves, during the day we were put to work having hauling wood from the outskirts of the town, remained here about 3 months when we were put aboard a train and brought to a place called Vaginoky, in Poland where we were quartered in a Barracks the food here was as bad as ever, but at this time we were receiving our parcels from the British Red Cross, so were not forced to eat their food, remained here until 19th of November 1918 when we were again put on board a train and taken back to Sniderville where we remained for six days where we were put aboard another train and after a short run arrived at a German seaport town where I embarked for England and arrived in Aberdeen.



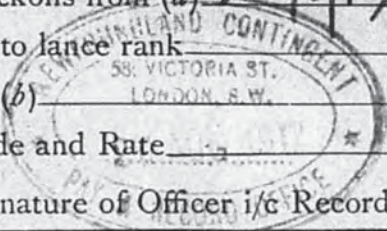
