NOTES.—(i.) Sir:-

The marginally noted man was wounded by shrapnel in Gallipoli. His head was fractured, he suffered from paralysis of both legs for four days; he also suffered from severe headaches and occasional double vision. He had one operation at Malta when a piece of bone was removed. He was also wounded in the Wrist but this slight wound caused no disability.

He was granted by a Medical Board at the 3rd London General Hospital on January 7th., 1916, Total disability for six months, to be followed by one-half disability.

On his return to this country he was boarded on December 22nd., 1916, and granted 20% disability for twelve months, his condition being reported as the same as that at the 3rd London General Hospital on the 30th. of December, 1915. It was noted on this date, December 22nd., 1916, that his headaches had improved but that he still suffered from occasional double vision.

He was again boarded on December 14th., 1917, and the following was recorded:-

"Works alright in his present position but cannot work at his trade (Cooper). Stopping causes giddiness. He has been employed as Messenger in the Board of Agriculture."

During the warm weather, towards the end of the

season this man complained to me that he was suffering greatly from headaches, and unless something could be done for him he would have to cease work. He attributed these headaches, which were of much the same character as those which he had been suffering from following upon his wound, to the wound in his head. In order, before sending him up before a Medical Board, that I might ascertain whether these headaches were possibly due to other causes, I sent him to Dr. Murphy, Eye, Ear, Nose and Throat Specialist, in order that he might examine his nose and ears. Two other courses were open to me:

- (1) Either to tell him that as he was in receipt of a pension, and had been discharged, that he was now a private citizen and must look after himself, or
- (2) To take him off his job and recommend him for admission to the General or Convalescent Hospital.

Both Hospitals were full at the time and some delay would have been caused. The matter was urgent so I sent him to Dr. Murphy, and his findings were as follows:-

"With reference to the man Kearney. He was suffering from chronic headaches due to disease of the nose. The result of treatment was satisfactory. I saw him two months after I finished treatment and he had had no return up to that time."

This letter was dated November 22nd., 1917

Dr. Murphy's bill for this treatment has been turned down by the Pensions & Disabilities Board who state "that they cannot assume any responsibility for payment of this account, as the matter was not authorized by them, nor submitted for their approval, before treatment was given."

Sir,

A communication addressed to the Secretary of the Pensions and Disabilities Board by Major Rendell, Chief Staff Officer of your Department, was considered by our Board at its meeting last night with reference to a bill for \$11 on account of ex-Private William Kearney, Newfoundland Regiment, for medical services given this man by Dr. G.N. Murphy of this city; and it was agreed that I should write you and explain the situation.

At a previous meeting of this Board a bill for \$11 for treatment for Kearney was presented to us. The bill was certified by Surgeon Major Macpherson, but there was no information supplied, and under these circumstances the Board took the position "that they could not assume any responsibility for the payment of this amount as the matter was not authorized by them nor submitted for their approval before treatment was given!"

Surgeon Major Macpherson furnished a very full statement to your Department respecting this case, which might as well have been furnished to us at the outset, in which event there might probably have been no delay in the payment of the bill, and no need to take the matter to you, as any additional information required could have been as promptly secured.

With reference, however, to this case, our Board would call attention to the fact that in the finding of Dr. Murphy with regard to this man, as quoted by Surgeon Major Macpherson, there is no evidence that the disease calling for treatment was due to Kearney's military service, though possibly it may have helped to aggravate a physical defect ascribable to the wounds sustained by him at Gallipoli. Dr. Murphy's finding, you will note, is that the man was suffering from chronic headaches due to disease of the nose.

Before we can undertake to pay this bill, we shall have to know whether or not this disease of the nose was the result of Kearney's wounds. It does not follow that because a man has been a soldier

or sailor and has been wounded, that after he has been pensioned this Board must become liable for his doctor's bills. For instance, if Kearney were to fall and break his leg, that surely would not be an obligation on us, but if it could be proved that the cause of his falling and breaking his leg was some physical condition following upon his wounds, then the matter would assume a different complexion.

Surgeon Major Macpherson says that two courses were open to him---either to tell Kearney that as he was in receipt of a pension, and had been discharged, he was now a private citizen and must look after himself, or (2) to take him off his job and recommend him for admission to the General or Convalescent Hospital.

The first alternative would be the proper one if the man's disability was not due to his wounds; the second alternative, namely to send him to an hospital or the course which Dr. Macpherson took, to send him to a specialist, would apply if his disability was due to his wounds.

On this point there is yet nothing certain, and when we obtain a definite declaration as to that, we shall be prepared to further consider the matter.

With further reference to the case of Private W.W. Kearney, I would say that we had this before our special Committee on Patriotic Fund cases yesterday and we propose

(a) that inasmuch as you state that, pending the receipt of his final discharge, Private Kearney is carried on the rolls of the Newfoundland Regiment on full pay, he be allowed fifty cents per day towards his maintenance, as all volunteers in the city are now receiving, which, with his pay of \$1.10 will mean \$1.60 per day for him;

(b) that when his papers arrive and he is finally discharged, he be paid an allowance of \$5.00 weekly pending the settlement of the question of pensions, as this is the amount which, under the Canadian pension scale, a soldier so disabled as to be incapable of earning his livelihood would receive, and I judge that from Kearney's condition he will not be able to do much for some time, the more especially as his father, who is a cooper by trade, is stated by him to be suffering from consumption and to be only allowed by Dr. Rendell to get up for two hours daily, with the result that his business is practically ended;

(c) that with respect to having the silver shield fitted to the wound in his skull, we propose that this shall be carried out at the General Hospital by the doctors of the staff there, which will save us what it would cost to have this operation performed by other surgeons.

We trust that these arrangements will commend themselves to you.


