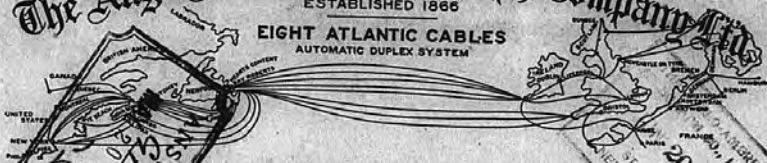

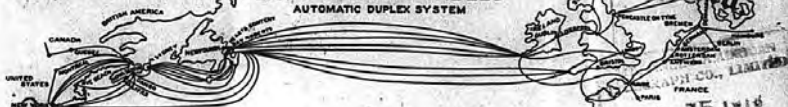

I ordered him the usual treatment rest &c. and am sending him Sassafras for the cough.

On examining the lungs I found coarse râles well distributed over both lungs. Increased vocal fremitus and some pleuris over L. apex.

A very soft blowing murmur can be heard over the pulmonary valve.

The râles are so coarse that an estimation of the character of the breathing is hard to estimate.

The cough is more troublesome at night and in early morning.

The patient is very weak and cannot sit up for any length of time.

Sir:-

Since receiving your second telegram I have visited Private O'Keefe twice and have seen him in all 3 times. He is steadily improving, but had another slight haemorrhage last Friday, but the spiritum was cleared when I saw him yesterday. The cough is also leaving him - and the lungs are clearing up with the exception of some moist râles under the clavicle where he says he feels a "sore spot" when he coughs. I have advised him to rest with the usual reconstructive diet (he can get an abundance of milk and eggs) so that in a few weeks I think he will get along all right.

I don't think it will be necessary to visit him again as he is mending rapidly, moreover the roads to Cohinet are almost impassible (On my second trip I was 2 days accomplishing the 40 miles and in addition slept in the car all night having got bogged in the soft road) Cohinet seems to be absolutely isolated. From the Saluonier side there is no thoroughfare and unlikely to be any for 2 or 3 weeks yet when some dry weather sets in. I would certainly recommend that O'Keefe should be discharged as he will only be a constant expense if retained. By the way would you please advise us whom to send my bill to for the work.

We were the first motor car ever over the Colnech Road.

HAEMOPTYSIS FOLLOWING INFLUENZA

9. History: **Of Pleurisy at twelve years of age. Previous to this health quite good. Since this attack been constantly ill, with pain in left side of chest, with severe night sweats. On May 16th., 1918 enlisted and was fairly well until June 13 when on home leave he became ill with rigors, loss of strength, pain in chest and spitting of blood. Was seen by Dr. Gill of Brigus.**

10. What is his present condition?

(This is the important question. Be brief—the clearer the case the less need be written. Read note f above.)

General condition. Nutrition is good Temp. 98.4. Pulse 92. Lymphatic system negative. Respiratory system: chest moves well on inspiration, vocal fremitus plus on right side. Vocal resonance plus on right side of chest.
