I have received a letter from my husband Michael Kenedy, 2552. of the Newfoundland Regiment, who is now an inmate of the 2nd London General Hospital, King's Road Chelsea, London, asking me to beg of Your Excellency to obtain for him sufficient leave of absence to enable him to come home to see his friends and regain his health. He is over two years now on active service, and has been wounded the second time. I am not well enough to see Your Excellency personally, nor ~~am~~ ^{am} I able to tell Your Excellency how much I long to see my husband after all his sufferings, and how I think I could nurse him back to health better than in the hospital: but as local commandant of the Newfoundland Regiment you can, I am sure, have my wish granted.
