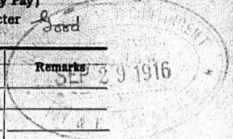

Sir,-

With reference to the communication of Squires & Winter dated September 6th. 1917. regarding claim of Nicholas Kennedy of 11 Pleasant Street, father of Michael Francis Kennedy, who was killed in action on July 1st. 1916, I beg to report that I have already had this man's case before the Pensions & Disabilities Board, but no action was taken at the present time, to give Mr. Kennedy an opportunity to prove conclusively to the satisfaction of the Board that he can be considered a dependent upon his late son.

This soldier, Michael Francis Kennedy formerly had an allotment payable to the Bank of Nova Scotia, and the amount payable under this allotment would be placed to his own credit only. The allotment was cancelled sometime prior to his decease.

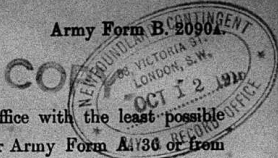
As the son did not make an allotment to the father or one of the family, while he was alive, it would naturally be understood that he did not consider his father to be dependent upon him. If, as the father states, the son was in the habit of sending him money from time to time, he should produce definite evidence to this effect, but until such time, as he can do so, his case cannot be favourably considered by the Pensions & Disabilities Board.

As Dr. McGrath is out of town and Mr. Bennett is about leaving I am referring Mr. Kennedy to your courteous attention for a few minutes, as during Mr. Bennett's absence from town the burden of his Department devolves upon you.

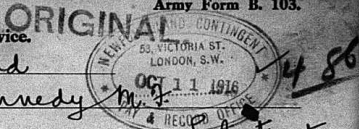
