I do not know the details and have only Mr. Pike's version. I promised Mr. Pike before I left Chapeau that I would do my utmost for him in this matter while here.

Referring to your letter of October 3rd, I beg to state that I have already communicated with Mr.Pike regarding the order which he holds from Pte.King. I regret very much that I can do nothing for him in the matter, as an Official form is provided ^{for} the very purpose for which this order was given, and I have been instructed not to recognize any other form.

Had it been presented before King left for England something might have been done in the matter but as I have nothing to do at the present time with the pay of the men that have gone to England, except paying any Allotments which the men may have declared I cannot make payment from any of these allotments, without the consent of the party to whom the allotment is payable. I have advised Mr.Pike that the best thing for him to do is to get in communication with King himself, and ask him to provide funds to cover the order.

A long time ago I sent you concerning separation allowance for my mother. You or somebody else sent my ~~father's~~ mother some papers to fill in she did so and you or some other person in the Militia Dept rec'd them, because she received a letter saying the papers were intended for Father. Then she rec'd some papers from the Militia Dept for some returned soldiers to fill out for War Service Fraternity. Both of her sons 2430 W. J. Ray & 2646 A. King, were killed in France. Father died in August 1900. Mother & Sister Lily B. Ray were entirely depending

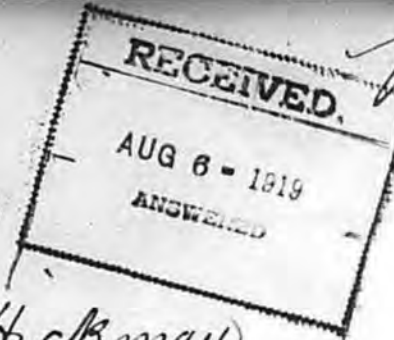
on working for support in every way.
 Wives of soldiers while on active
 service get \$20.00 a month as
 separation allowance. I want
 to say or rather ask you is my
 Mother entitled to the same
 amount as wife of a
 soldier, in amount to the same
 thing. Mother depending on son wife
 depending on husband. Then if she
 cannot get it simply
 because she is his mother & not
 his wife, she must be satisfied
 with the luck because her
 two boys were perfectly willing
 to bleed & die in France. If
 she is entitled to the separation
 allowance I think it is high

time for some one in authority to wake
up & see that my widowed
mother who is suffering from
nervous Debility as a certificate
from Dr Bodow can prove,
gets her rights.

If you are

Some long time ago, some papers were sent to my mother - from your Dept. which I filled in for her before Noah Miller Jt. A little while after she rec'd a letter from same Dept saying that these papers were intended for Father. Now Sir I beg to state that my father died in August 1910. Then they sent some more papers for her to fill out which were really intended for some returned Soldier. How could she answer questions which were only legal for some Soldier back from the firing line. Her two only sons (with the exception of myself who is married and with that a School Teacher and can scarcely make two ends meet) enlisted in the Spring of 1916. Their names were W. J. King and Aaron King. She was and still is entirely depending on W. J. King as the youngest Aaron King was also a School Teacher when he enlisted. W. J. King was killed in action April 14

1917 Aaron King was killed in action Dec 3/17
 Somebody must have been considering
 my mother's case as they sent and asked
 my mother for my marriage Certificate
 My father died 1910, when I was 21.
 W. J. King 17 and Aaron King was 14. I was
 out Teaching when my father died and
 was only supporting myself. My mother
 and little sister was depending on the
 small pittance those two boys W. J.
 and Aaron made at the fishery. Then
 Aaron when he got 16 he went Teaching
 then he was providing for himself
 From then, until W. J. King got old enough
 enlisted he was the sole help & support
 of my mother. I think it is a sin, yea a
 shame to treat a poor widowed mother
 who has given her sole support for King
 and Country, to suffer & die somewhere
 in blood ydrenched France.

 little, she is suffering from nervous
