With reference to this Office memorandum No. 16929/560/P&A, 22/11/18. The following further letter has been received from Mrs Lane, dated 25/11/18 (11086):-

"I wrote to you some time ago
"about my son's money, and I have
"never received any answer, I
"think it is about time now, I
"knew something about it. It is
"his back gone money, that is,
"since he left Scotland in March
"to go to France, up until the
"time of his death in August. He
"was a prisoner in Germany and
"died there. I would like to
"know the reason why I dont get it
"and all the rest has got it for
"long ago. I think he done as
"much as the rest of them, and I
"am entitled to his money, as he
"was my only help. And he gave
"his life for his King and Country.
"So I think I should get what
"belongs to him. It is now
"fifteenth months since he died,
"and I expect you's should know
"some-thing about his money by
"this time. So please answer this
"letter and let me know all
"particulars about it."

Mrs. Lane has been advised that all particulars available regarding her late son's estate were forwarded to you 22/10/18, and it has been pointed out to her that all enquiries from relatives of serving or deceased Soldiers forwarded to this office direct are replied to through your Office, please.





The parents of Gideon Lane of Jamestown are very anxious to know if any particulars relating to his death can be had. Pte. Lane was taken prisoner in April 14. 1917. ~~His~~ His sister received one letter from him, written I believe in May. The parents received no letter. On October 19th I received a message that ~~the~~ he had died in enemy hands. Is there any possible means of getting any further particulars?

Apparently Pte. Lane was not wounded, and there is so much mystery about the death of prisoners in Germany that it is not strange that the parents have all kinds of forbodings about them. They imagine they were starved and all kinds of things. You will understand, I am sure, how much ~~the~~ broken hearted parents prize the smallest bit of information about their loved ones who have fallen, and especially those who have died in enemy hands. These are the saddest cases who die in enemy hands, and I suppose it is impossible to get any news about them. But if in time anything further could be promised it would be a great comfort to those affectionate parents. I know you will do anything in your power.

With reference to the following letter from Mrs. Thomas Lane, Portland Bonavista Bay, 18/9/18, (8752):-

"Just a note to see what about my son's money. You see he left Scotland to go to France on the fourth of March and he was taken a prisoner by the Germans on the fourteenth of April, and then we received a telegram saying that he died on the seventh August. That was last year 1917, that it happened. So it is his money since he left Scotland up until the time of his death. I don't see why I should not get mine same as other mothers as he was my only help, and ones that were taken a prisoner the same time as he, and died also, has got their money for long ago. So I would like to know the reason why I don't get mine, as he done his duty as well as the rest of them. I wrote to the Pay & Record Office here, twice and they wrote back and said they were waiting from word from yours. So I thought it better to write you myself. I need the money now seeing he is gone and him being my only help. So I will be very pleased to hear from you as soon as possible."

Is there any possible means of getting any further particulars.

Apparently Pte. Lane was not wounded, and there is so much mystery about the death of prisoners in Germany that it is not strange that the parents have all kinds of forbodings about them. They imagine they were starved and all kinds of things. You will understand, I am sure, how much these broken hearted parents prize the smallest bit of information about their loved ones who have fallen, and especially those who have died in enemy hands. These are the saddest cases who die in enemy hands, and I suppose it is impossible to get any news about them. But if in time anything further could be promised it would be a great comfort to those affectionate parents. I know you will do anything in your power.
