Circumstances of Capture - When the Germans broke through on our left they soon came around us on all sides in large numbers, we were scattered about in twos and threes in shell-holes, and so were taken prisoners.

DETAILS OF LIFE & TREATMENT UNDER CAPTURE - After a few days at Douai and Fort McDonald, Lille I was sent to work behind the German Lines under our fire at Marquion. I was kept here until the beginning of June, when I was sent to Hospital at Tournai for two months suffering from general weakness and septic sores on my legs. This condition was brought about by the lack of food and living in the dirt. We had no change of cloths at all, and had to sleep on damp muddy ground just as we were with no blankets or greatcoats. Our food consisted of a slice of black bread and a bowl of watery soup once a day. We had to drink the soup out of our steel helmets until we could pick up some old tins or other sort of receptacle. On the whole, the treatment was very very bad and we were very glad to get away from it.

After Hospital I was sent to Deanain for about 4 months, working at demolishing factories and removing machinery. Then I was shifted to Germany and arrived at Schneidermuhl for 2 days I was sent to work on a farm at Stubboza(?) in Poland. I worked here for about 8 months. The conditions were much better especially after the food parcels from the Red Cross began to arrive; anyway and we were very glad to get them, as the farmers themselves has very little to eat. Then I moved to Krucheritz (,?) to work in a sugar factory there and was kept there till the Armistice was signed. I was repatriated via Danzig and arrived in Leith on December 18, 1918.




