MEDICAL HISTORY OF AN INVALID

They will distinctly state the authority for statements not resulting from their personal observation; it must be made clear whether such statements are obtained from the soldier concerned, from witnesses, or from documents.
4. Special care is required in answering question 13. Please read the questions carefully. All questions must be answered.
5. If space provided under any sections is insufficient use blank space, page 4 or add another sheet. Such entries or sheets must be initialed by the Medical Board.
6. A note will be made of attached papers by the Medical Board under the section "Opinion of Medical Board."
7. Under no circumstances may information other than that in sections 8, 9 and 10 be communicated to the soldier, directly or indirectly.
8. The nomenclature of diseases must be followed, if possible, as described in "List of Diseases" printed in the order in which they appear in the Annual Report on the Health of the Army, published in London, (1915), by Messrs. Harrison & Sons.

I have this day examined this man and find that he is suffering from Tachycardia - over rapid action of the heart - which will prevent him from carrying on full duties required for active service.

There is nothing to be found wrong in his lungs. He does not complain of any cough and there are no grounds for any supposition of Plithisis.

He is at present in quarantine for mumps and will return to Barracks in three days, when his case will be put before a Travelling Medical Board for consideration.

This man claims to have had this heart trouble two years before enlisting.

While in barracks here he was taken with Mumps and is now on Quarantine at 21 Field Street, St. John's. From the Officer Commanding Draft, I understand that Little was returned to St. John's account of Heart Trouble. No Sick Report has been received that would indicate that he is developing consumption. In fact he has not been on parade since he arrived until he contracted Mumps. I have written Halifax about his papers and will telegram today. I will advise you if anything new occurs.

Above noted man returned from Halifax ex Draft of June 11th, without any Medical papers. While waiting for same he was taken with Mumps on 1-9-18 and is now in Quarantine at 21 Field Street.

From Captain Nunns, Officer Commanding of that draft, I find that Little was returned to St. John's for discharge on account of Disordered Action Heart, this information being given him by office of D. M. S., Halifax, and was further informed that documents would follow in course of few days. To date they have not been received at Depot. Little has been twice sent to Depot Medical Department to have papers made out but they say they cannot deal with him until they receive documents from Halifax.

No Sick Report has been received that would indicate that Little is developing Consumption, in fact he has not been on Sick Parade for any complaint since his return, until he developed Mumps.

I wish to bring before your notice the case of above noted man and to request that you furnish me with a full report re same.

This man embarked for overseas on 11-6-18 and was returned to Depot on 24-6-18 from Halifax, without any documents accompanying him. On his arrival at Depot he was sent to Medical Department for attention. I understand his case was not dealt with then and that he was remanded pending information concerning him. In this connection I would point out that during his absence from Newfoundland, Sick Reports from Halifax for Draft 11-6-18 were received by Orderly Room from District Officer Commanding and passed over to Medical Department.
