Stone his enlistment he has had an allotment in her favour of 50 cents per day, i.e. 14/5 per week, plus 01d Age Pension 7/6, or 10/7 less than she received previous to his enlistment. Mers Loudoun has no other children and apart from the 01d Age Pension of 7/6 per week, Bandeman Loudoun is her sole support.

The clause in the Newfoundland Regulations for Separation Allowance "Sole Support" debars her from participating in the benefits of Separation Allowance, in so far as she receives "Old Age Pension" and her son is not therefore her sole support."

If finally Mrs. Loudoun is considered as being eligible for Separation Allowance, it may besirable to define "sole support" as follows:

"A Soldier who is an only child may be considered to be the "sole "support" of a dependant who is not in receipt of more than 10/
"or #2.50 per week from any other source, such as Old Age Pension, "National Relief Fund, Dividends or Private Investments".

It is understood from the Canadians that where widowed Mothers are in receipt of Old age Pensions they are not elegible for Separation Allowance. Some time ago it was recommended by the officer i/o of the Claims Branch, O.M.F.C. that there should be three different scales to meet such cases, o.g.,

Sole Support \$20.00 per month, Secondary Support, 15.00 " " Contributory Support, 10.00 "

Contributory Support, which up to now has not been accepted by the Canadian Government, but possibly may be considered by the Newfoundland Government.

'It is strongly recommended that some such scale should be introduced in the Newfoundland Regulations, as it is clearly a hardship that a case such as Mrs. Loudoum's should be rejected because she is in receipt of such a small sum of 7/8 per week from a source other than her son's allotment.

It is understood that the object of the grant of Separation Allowance is to assist in maintaining the Soldier's dependants, within a certain limit, up to the pre-emlistment basis.

Regarding Old Age Pensions. The Canadian Office states that such Pension is granted only in a case where the applicant is in receipt of not more than 9/- per week, from all sources.

Therefore is Mrs. Loudoun received 25/- per week, over and above the cost of Board and Lodging from her son before he enlisted she would not have received 01d Age Pensions The General principle adopted by the Old Age Pension Commissioners, is to make up the applicants income to 13/e per week, which was considered in pre-war days as being a fair allowance for maintenance, this would suggest that Mrs. Loudoun received only 5/6 per week from her son, instead of 25/e as stated.

The amount estimated by the Canadians for the cost of Board and Lodging is from 15/- to 25/- per week according to the son's employment. They suggest that the accuracy of Mrs. Loudoun's statement may be tested by reference to the Local Pensions Committee, who would be in a position to institute necessary inquiry. If it is desired that this suggestion should be given effect, your instructions are requested, please.



It is strongly recommended that some such scale should be intro-duced in the Newfoundland Aggulations, as it is clearly a hardship that a case such as Mrs-Loudoun's should be rejected because she is in receipt of such a small sum of 7/0 per week from a source other than her som's allotment.

It is understood that the object of the grant of Separation Allow-ance is to assist in maintaining the Soldier's dependants, within a certain limit, up to the pre-emitationnt basis.

Regarding Old Age Pensions. The Canadian Office states that such Pension is greated only in a case where the applicant is in receipt of not more than 9/- per week, from all sources.

Therefore is Mrs. Loudom received SS/- per week, over and above the cost of Beard and Lodging from her son before he emitsted she would not have received Old Age Femileus

The General principle adopted by the Old Age Pension Commissioners, is to make up the applicants income to 13/- per week, which was considered in pre-aar days as being a fair allowance for maintenance, this would suggest that have Loudous received only 5/c per week from her son, instead of 25/- as stated.

The amount estimated by the Garantians for the cost of Board and Lodging is from 15,- to 25,- per week according to the son's employment. They suggest that the accuracy of Mrs. Loudoun's statement may be tested by reference to the Local Pensions Committee, who would be in a position to institute measurery inquiry. The Soldier is claiming the Allowance for his Widowed Hother, aged 75 years. Her husband died in 1900, Prier to Loudoun's emlishment he was earning 50/- per week of which he contributed 40/- per week, including payment for Board and Ledging. The net smount allowed for Board etc. may be estimated at 15/- per week, leaving balance towards his Mother's maintenance of 25/- per week. She also received Old Age Pension of 7/5 per week. Her total income before his enlishment was therefore filizité. Since his enlishment he has hed an allotwent in her awour of 50 cents per day, i.e. 14/5 per week, plus Cid Age Pension 7/6, but 10/7 less than she received previous to his enlishment. Her Loudous has no other children and spart from the Old Age Pension of 7/6 per week, Bandesan Loudoun is her acle support. Bandsman Loudoum is her sole support.

The clause in the Newfoundland Regulations for Separation Allowance "Sole Support" debars her from participating in the benefits of Separation Allowance, in so far as she receives "Old Age Pension" and her son is not therefore her sole support."

If finally Mrs. Loudoun is considered as being eligible for Separation Allewance, it may besirable to define "sele support" as follow "as Soldier who is an only child may be considered to be the "sele "support" of a dependant who is not in receipt of more than 10/- "or \$8.50 per week from any other source, such as Old Age Pension, "maticnal Belief Fund, Dividends or Frivate Investments".

It is understood from the Canadians that where widowed Nothers are in reacht of Old age Pensions they are not elegible for Separation allowance. Some time age it was recommended by the Officer i/e of the Oldsime Prenche Old-Pet. that there should be three different scales to meet such cases, e.g.,

Sole Support


Regarding Old Age Pensions. The Canadian Office states that a Pension is greated only in a case where the applicant is in receipt of not more than 8/- per week, from all sources.

Therefore is Mrs. Loudoun received 85/- per week, over and al the cost of Board and Ledging from her son before he emississ she we not have received 0.1 dep Fensions

The General principle adopted by the Old Age Pennion Commissioners, is to make up the applicants income to 13/- per week, which was considered in pre-war days as being a fair allowance for maintenance, this would suggest that here Loudous received only 5/6 per week from her son, instead of 15/- as stated.

The amount estimated by the Canadians for the cost of Board and Lodging is from 15/- to 25/- per west according to the son's employment. They suggest that the accuracy of Nrs. Loudenn's statement may be tested by reference to the Local Pensions Committee, who would be in a position to institute necessary inquiry. If it is desired that this suggestion should be given effect, your instructions are requested, please.



The Canadian Act which is similar to the Newfoundland Pensions Act, is similarly interpreted.

Mrs. Loudoun's case is before the Minister of Militia, for consideration, and recently formed the subject of several telegrams from this Office, to which it is hoped realiss will

soon be available.

MEMORANDIM FOR MINISTER OF MILITIA.

Subject:- Claim for Separation Allowance, S181, Bdsm. J. Loudown.

The Soldier is claiming the Allowance for his Widowed Nother, aged 73 years. Her husband died in 1900, Prier to Loudoun's enlistment he was earning 50/- per week of which he contributed, per week, including payment for Spard and Lodging. The net amount allowed for Spard and Lodging. The net amount allowed for Spard to the state of the Spard etc. may be estimated at 18/- per week, leaving believed for Spard in Souther's maintenance of 25/- per week. She also received 0.0486 Pension of 7/6 per week. Her total income before his enlistment as therefore 21:12:6. Since his enlistment he has had an allowent in her favour of 50 cents per day, i.e. 14/5 per week, plus 0.1d age Pension 76, or 10/7 less than she received previous to his enlistment. Hrs. Loudoun has no other children and spart from the Old Age Pension of 7/8 per week, Sendeman Loudoun is her sole support.

The clause in the Newfoundland Regulations for Separation Allowance "Sole Support" debare her from participating in the benefits of Separation Allowance, in so far as she receives "Old Age Pension" and her son is not the

If finally Mrs. Loudoun is considered as being eligible for Separation Allewance, it may besirable to define "sole support" as follows:

"A Soldier who is an only child may be considered to be the "sole "support" of a dependant who is not in receipt of more than 10/
"or \$2.50 per week from any other source, such as Old age Pension,

"Rational Relief Fund, Dividends or Private Investments".

It is understood from the Canadians that where widowed Mothers are in receipt of Old Age Pensions they are not elogible for Separation Allowance. Some time ago it was recommended by the Officer i/o of the Claims Branch, C.M.F.C. that there should be three different scales to meet such cases, e.g.,

Sole Support

\$20.00 per month,

Secondary Support, 15.00 s Secondary Support, 15.00 s 10.00 s which up to now has not been accepted by the Ganadian Government, but possible may be considered by the Newfoundland Government.

It is strongly recommended that some such scale should be intro-duced in the Memfoundland Regulations, as it is clearly a hardship that a case such as Nrs- Loudoun's should be rejected because she is in receipt of such a small sum of 7/6 per week from a source other than her son's allotment.

It is understood that the object of the grant of Separation Allowance is to assist in maintaining the Soldier's dependants, within a certain limit, up to the pre-enlistment basis.

Could it not be arranged that in such cases as Mrs. Loudoum's, Separation Allowance be issued, less income from other sources, e.g., Separation Allowance, per 28 days Lees Old Age Pension, 2 4 weeks Net amount payable ----£5: 16: 0

1: 10: 0 22: 6: 0

Regarding old age Pensions. The Canadian Office states that such Pension is granted only in a case where the applicant is in receipt of not more than 8/- per week, from all sources.

Therefore is Mrs. Loudoun received 25/- per week, over and above the cost of Board and Lodging free her son before he emiliated she would not have received Old Age Pensions

The Seneral principle adopted by the Old Age Pennion Commissioners, is to make up the applicants income to 13/- per week, which was considered in pre-ear days as being a fair allowance for mintenance, this would suggest that kre- London received only 5/6 per week from her son, instead of 25/- as estated.

The amount estimated by the Canadians for the cost of Board on the deging is from 15/- to 25/- per week according to the son's amplion ment. They suggest that the accuracy of Nuss. Loudoun's statement may be tested by reference to the Local Pensions Committee, who would be in a position to institute necessary inquiry. If it is desired that this suggestion should be given effect, your instructions are requested, please.
