STATEMENT OF PRISONER OF WAR.

#1808 Pte. Hollett Manuel - Norris Arm.

Enlisted September 1915 - Proceeded Overseas Oct. 1915

Company in France - "D" Company

Place & Date of Capture - Monchy-le-Preux, April 14th, 1917.

Circumstances of Capture - I was a Lewis Gunner, and when the Germans came through and surrounded us I had no ammunition left and was lying in a shell-hole with two other men one of whom was killed and the other wounded. The last man and myself were taken prisoners.

Details of Life & Treatment under Capture - After a few days at Douai & Compt. Donald, Lille I was sent to Gresnain for about 3 months working on the Railway. The treatment here was just the same as has been told by all the other men with regard to the food and the work and the accommodation. I was then shifted to Marchiennes for about two months working in the woods there, and the treatment improved a little. My next move was to Anish for about two months working on a Railwat siding. Then I was sent to Germany and arrived at Sommermuhle where I was kept for two days and then to Altdamm. From here we were sent out on working parties around the district, and remained there until the Armistice was signed. For three months I was working in the woods, five months on a farm, and about two months in a sugar factory. When the Red Cross parcels began to arrive the conditions were not so bad. I was repatriated via Copenhagen and arrived at Hull on December 14th, 1918.




