Where Captured: Monchy le Preux. Date April 14th 1917.

Circumstances surrounding the Capture.

During the attack my company had become considerably reduced in numbers our left flank was exposed to the enemy owing to the Regiment (Essex) retiring. We were completely surrounded and forced to surrender. Our Company Officer was mortally wounded and before he died he realized that we had no chance of beating the enemy off, due to superiority in numbers, and told us to surrender. We were seven or eight in number.

Details of life and treatment in Captivity.

I was taken prisoner about 10 a.m. on the 14th and with others congregated in a small village behind the German lines. About an hour afterwards our party (about 500) began a march to Douai, twenty miles distant. The only food we received that day was a piece of black bread about 6 P.m. At Douai we spent four or five days in an old barracks and our rations were a piece of bread and barley water each day. We were then taken to Lille and were confined at Fort McDonald. The conditions here were the worst experienced by me during my detention as a prisoner in Germany. We were imprisoned in a foul smelling concrete room with no ventilation and with a barrel placed in one corner of the room to be used as a latrine. There were about one hundred men confined in the abominable hole. There was no increase or improvement in food here and if possible it was worse. We remained at Fort McDonald about five days when we entrained for an unknown destination and for the following 48 hours received no food whatever. We now came under our own shell fire at Marouin and were put to work repairing roads, working on ammunition dumps, etc. etc. I was working behind the lines for about ten months and was much reduced in strength and weight due almost entirely to starvation rations. I was then sent to Schrieldmuhl, and Altdamm. At the latter place I was working on a farm for eight months from daylight to dark. My parcels from the N.W.C.A. were now arriving regularly. I was also well provided with clothing. About a month before the armistice was signed I was sent to Stralsund (officers camp) and found conditions here the best during my captivity. On December 5th about three weeks after the armistice was signed two English officers were shot by a sentry. I left the Camp on Dec. 9th for England via Denmark, and arrived at Ripon Dec. 19th 1918.
